

# MRS. SCHAEFER BABY CLAIMANT JUDGED INSANE

PORTLAND, Ore., July 2.—(AP)—Mrs. Lena L. Schaefer, one of the two women who claimed motherhood to a five months old infant awarded Miss Geraldine Watson, Los Angeles and Phoenix, was taken to the state hospital at Salem today after commitment by Judge Thaxwell.

George L. Schaefer, the woman's husband, signed an insanity complaint against her. He told the court she threw a coffee pot at him, attempted suicide by inhaling gas and tossed an armful of groceries out of the home.

Deputy sheriffs, who accompanied by a police matron, took Mrs. Schaefer to the sanitarium, where she was committed to a room to Mrs. Schaefer's bedroom to remove her.

# Talks of Electric Light Wizard Heard Around World



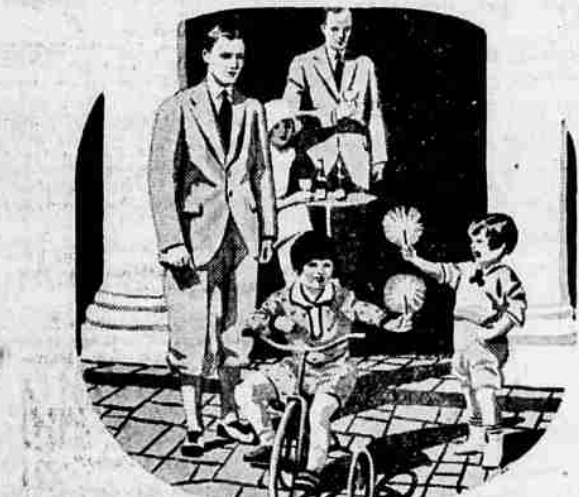
