Tru-Blu Stuffed Fruit Pudding

2 cups ground Tru-Blu Honey Graham crackers, 1/2 cup flour, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon cloves, 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup thick sour milk or buttermilk, 1 teaspoon soda, 1/2 cup molasses, 1 cup seeded raisins. Mix the first six ingredients. Add sour milk to which soda has been added. Then the molasses and raisins. Turn into greased pudding mold and steam 2 1/2 hours. Serves eight.
