DEMOCRATS HOPE FOR MORE SEATS AFTER ELECTIONS

BOSTON, July 15.—(Sp.)—A commanding position in congress awaits the Democratic party after the November elections, in the opinion of Jouett Shouse, chairman of the national Democratic executive committee.

In an address before the Jefferson society of Massachusetts here last night, he declared "our adversaries have practically admitted they will lose 30 or 40 house seats." He said it was a certainty the party would make startling gains in both houses of congress.

The enactment of the Grundy tariff bill was declared to be "part of a calculated movement to repay the large contributors to the Hoover campaign fund."
