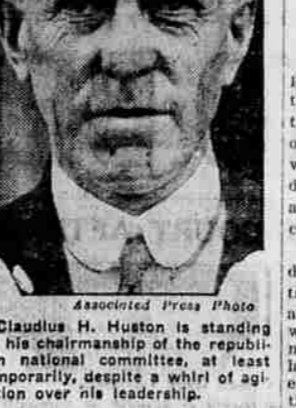

ROTARIAN HEALTH ADVICE GIVEN BY DOCTOR MEMBERS

Health was the subject of the program given at the luncheon of the Rotary club today noon at Hotel Medford under the leadership of Dr. W. W. P. Holt, and members were told what to eat, what to drink and how to wash their teeth, as well as the kind of tourist camps to visit.

Dr. Chan, T. Swearer chose the diet for his topic and warned Rotarians against eating heavy foods and drinking stimulants during the warm season. Most summer illnesses, he added, are caused from lack of common sense. He advised his audience to pay more attention to raising thoroughbred humans, adding that under the present conditions there is a rant in every family (casting no reflections at Dr. Holt).

Dr. B. C. Wilson, Jackson county health officer, chose tourists camps as his subject. Of the 300,000 tourists going through Medford each year, he stated, 70 per cent use tourist camps. A city, he pointed out, is judged by the type of camps surrounding it and emphasized the necessity for strictly sanitary conditions. Camp operators are co-operating with the state board of health in promoting better conditions and camps are improving each year, he added.

Dr. Burt Ingerson presented a lot of new information on an old topic, "The Tooth Brush," which grew into a glorious product in the minds of his listeners before he completed his speech.

Today's program was considered especially appropriate, as the majority of visitors at the luncheon were pathologists and physiologists in Medford for the convention which opened yesterday. Among them were Dr. C. C. Benson, Idaho State university; Prof. Clayton Long, Oregon State college; J. T. Hregger, Sebastopol, Cal., and W. A. Lucas and C. P. Harley of Wenatchee, Wash.

A beautifully printed and illustrated booklet received by the local club from Rotary clubs of Italy was exhibited at today's luncheon. The book tells the story of the most interesting scenic places in Italy and is printed in English.
