Mrs. Elva Sutton visited her father, Mr. McCallister, Monday.

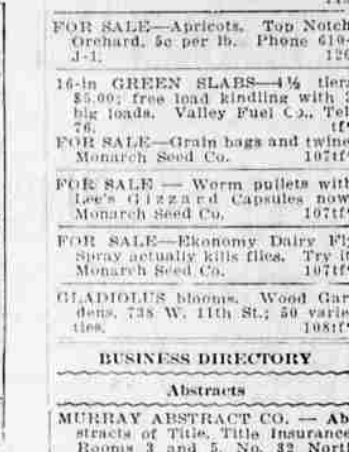
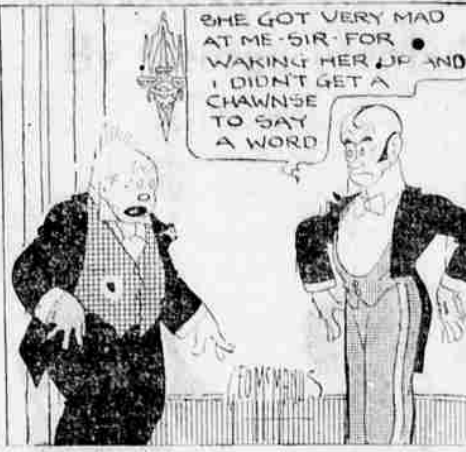
