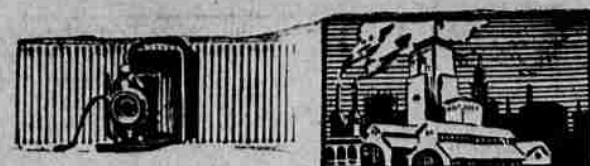
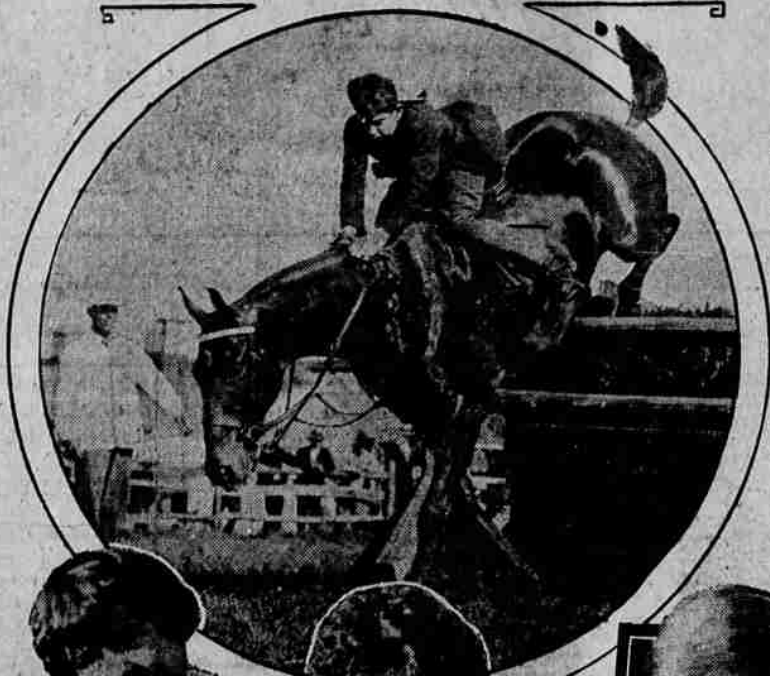


CAMERAGRAMS

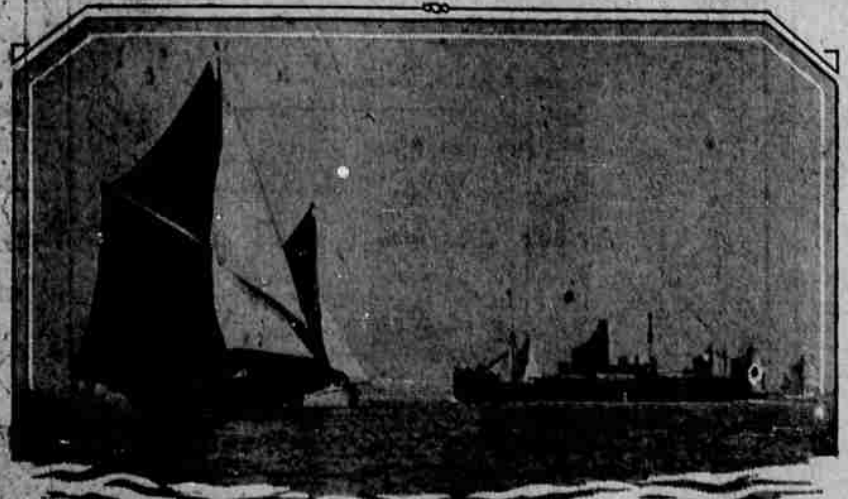
