WIDEN RIM ROAD TO DIAMOND LAKE

CRATER LAKE, Ore., July 29.—(Spl.)—The north rim road from the lodge to the Diamond Lake road and north to the park boundary has been put in excellent condition this past week. The Bates "50" caterpillar and bulldozer have been used in cutting off the roots of trees and widening the road from a trail to standard width.

Beginning the early part of this week the entire rim road will undergo a process of reconstruction. For this purpose a crew of men has been moved around to the old Wineglass cabin and a camp has been established. In order to establish the camp it was necessary to reconstruct the water pipeline down to the lake in order that water might be pumped to the camp on the rim for use by the employees.
