

NORBLAD TO AID IN PORT DEDICATION

Governor Will Be Speaker Monday Ceremony—Local Fliers With Air Tourists to Arrive for Celebration—Tickets Ready.

Two Medford fliers, John P. Waage and Bill Rosenbaum, are participants in the flight of the Pacific Northwest Air Tour, and will appear in the program of stunts and night flying to follow arrival of the fleet in this city Monday, August 4, according to announcement today.

Tickets for the celebration to be sponsored by the Medford post, American Legion, which will begin at 7:00 o'clock in the afternoon at the local field, went on sale this morning at the Chamber of Commerce building and will be placed in several business houses, according to Hob Dewel, chairman of the ticket committee.

Gov. A. W. Norblad will be one of the chief speakers at the banquet to be held at the Hotel Medford at 6:00 o'clock and the official dedication of the \$120,000 airport, scheduled for 8:00 o'clock in the hangar building, it was reported in an Associated Press dispatch from Salem this morning.

Letters Await Day.

Over 4000 letters have been received for mailing in the special dedication flight from the field Monday morning. C. T. Baker of the chamber of commerce stated today. All letters, to be marked with the special cachet must be mailed at the Chamber of Commerce building (not at the post office) not later than Saturday night. Residents of the valley are urged to take advantage of this opportunity to tell friends in all sections of the United States that Medford's airport has been officially dedicated.

The spectacular program arranged as fitting celebration of the dedication and arrival of the fleet from the north will be climaxed with a dance in the hangar building immediately after the dedication program, which is in charge of the city airport committee.

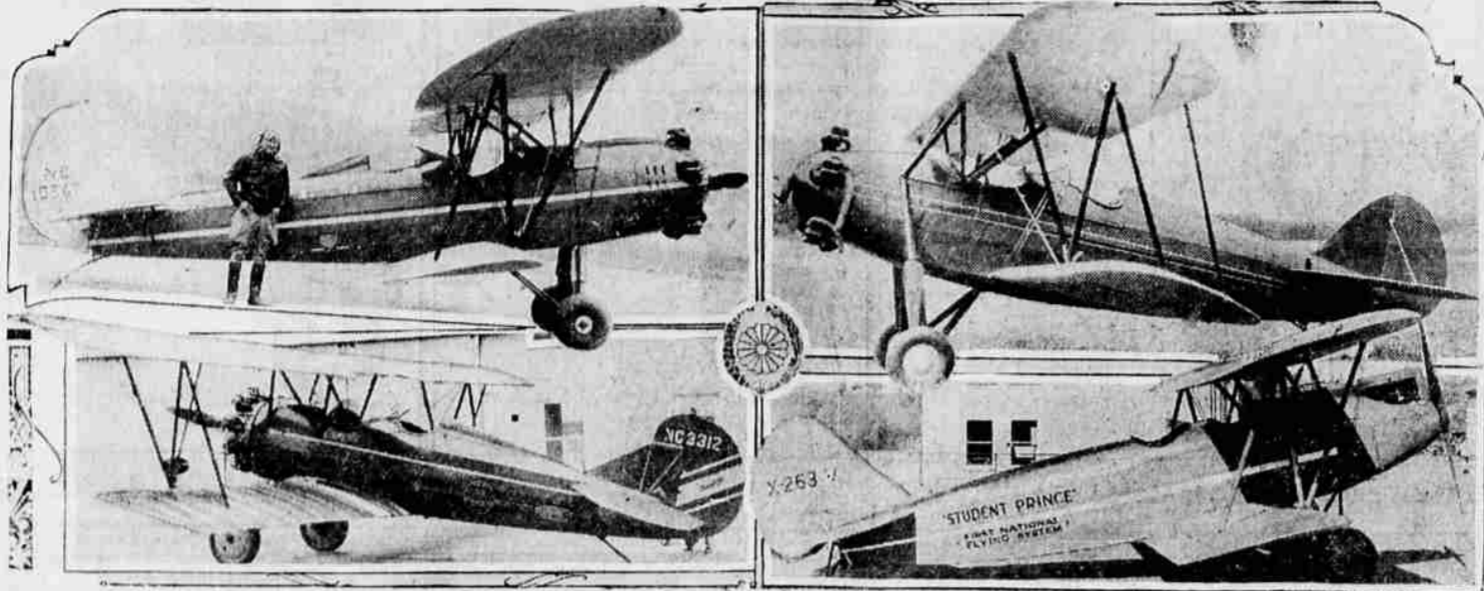
Eleven temples, a number of pyramids and many valuable specimens were found, according to first reports.

The third unit of the motor assemblage is the splendid motor truck which is Leo's cozy home while on his world tour.

The entire array will no doubt prove of exceptional interest to everyone in this city as Leo parades through the town and makes his more intimate personal appearance in front of the Fox Craterian theatre at 2:30 p. m.

Captain Volney Phifer, Leo's trainer and confidante, has assured us that on the occasion of their visit to Medford he will be happy to direct Leo through his repertoire of tricks and antics which prove him to be a beast of far more than ordinary intelligence.

HUGE CEMENT PLANT IS PLAN FOR PORTLAND

Three Million Dollar Concern Will Utilize Walowa County Marble Mountain Deposit.

PORTLAND, Ore., July 30.—(AP)—Announcement that a three million dollar cement plant will be established here was made late yesterday by officers of the Walowa Lime and Cement company, owners of property including Marble mountain in Walowa county. The plant will employ 300 men.

Lewis H. Mills of the Tidewater Timber company is president of the cement company.

Construction is expected to start within three or four months.

Dr. Scott said the company controls six thousand acres of patented land in Walowa county, in the center of which is Marble mountain containing millions of tons of marble.

This marble will be quarried, shipped to Portland by rail, and will be manufactured into cement, burned lime, paper rock for paper mills, nitrates, fertilizer materials and other products.

NANCY, France, July 30.—(AP)—The veterans of the four towns of the St. Mihiel sector today shook the hands and patted the backs of the doughboys who on September 12, 1918, delivered their townspeople from the enemy.

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NARCOTICS RINGSTERS ARRESTED

Leaders of Several Gangs Gathered in By Federal Agents—Turkey Source of Huge Supply—Detectives Pose As Peddlers.

WASHINGTON, July 30.—(AP)—Harry J. Amslinger, acting director of narcotics, announced today division agents had arrested the ring leaders of several gangs who have been importing millions of dollars worth of narcotics into this country from Turkey.

The largest gang, he said, was headed by Tony Lapinto, who lives on Long Island and was known as Black Tony. Lapinto and Frank Desco were arrested in New York. "Boss" Versace, prominent Norfolk, Va., Italian, and Joe Rejortella were arrested in Norfolk. Sam Ferreira, Joe Anzellone and

Pete Deagostina were taken into custody in Washington. Narcotic agents reported they had 69 ounces of heroin in their possession.

The acting director said J. A. Swinford, alias J. A. Kincaid, alias Reno Red, was captured in the Woolworth building in New York.

Nab Two in New York.

L. J. Williams, who lives on Long Island, but was taken into custody in New York, was described as the leader of a fifth gang and Frankie Fields, who narcotic agents said operated at Wilmington, Delaware, also was arrested in New York.

The investigation began about two months ago when an agent of one of the rings in Washington offered to sell illicit drugs to narcotic agent.

Agents then posed as peddlers with the result they traced narcotics coming into the Atlantic seaboard to a Turkish source.

The narcotics director said the ring headed by Lapinto imported more than \$1,000,000 in narcotics each year and Norfolk smugglers as much.
