

### LOWE OFF FOR ARRANGEMENT TRADE EXHIBIT

Harbor Assn. Aiding Southern Oregon and Northern California Counties Display Products.

D. M. Lowe, president of the Western States Exhibitors association, left last night for Sacramento to complete arrangements regarding the exhibit to be maintained by the Northern California-Southern Oregon Development association at the Pan-American Reciprocal Trade conference and the California State fair. Mr. Lowe has been retained by the development association to set up an exhibit representative of the mid-Pacific empire.

Every county in northern California and southern Oregon has shown considerable enthusiasm over the exhibit and it is expected that the display will be one of the best to be seen at the California capital during the trade conference and fair.

County agents, county courts, boards of supervisors and chambers of commerce throughout the territory are cooperating with the development association and the various products raised or manufactured in this section are being made ready for assembling in Medford on August 16th, preparatory to leaving for Sacramento.

#### Retain Individuality.

One of the features of the association's exhibit will be the fact that each county will retain its individuality and the various counties participating are vying with one another to present those products which would best advertise their communities. Many manufacturers have signified their intention of sending in their products.

The exhibit will be statistical in nature and will forcibly portray the resources of this section and the opportunities for development here along all lines. The importance of the Crescent City harbor to northern California and southern Oregon will be shown on a big relief map which will form the background of the exhibit.

Resultant publicity which will accompany the exhibit in both magazines and newspapers, will, according to officials of the development association, be of inestimable value to this section.

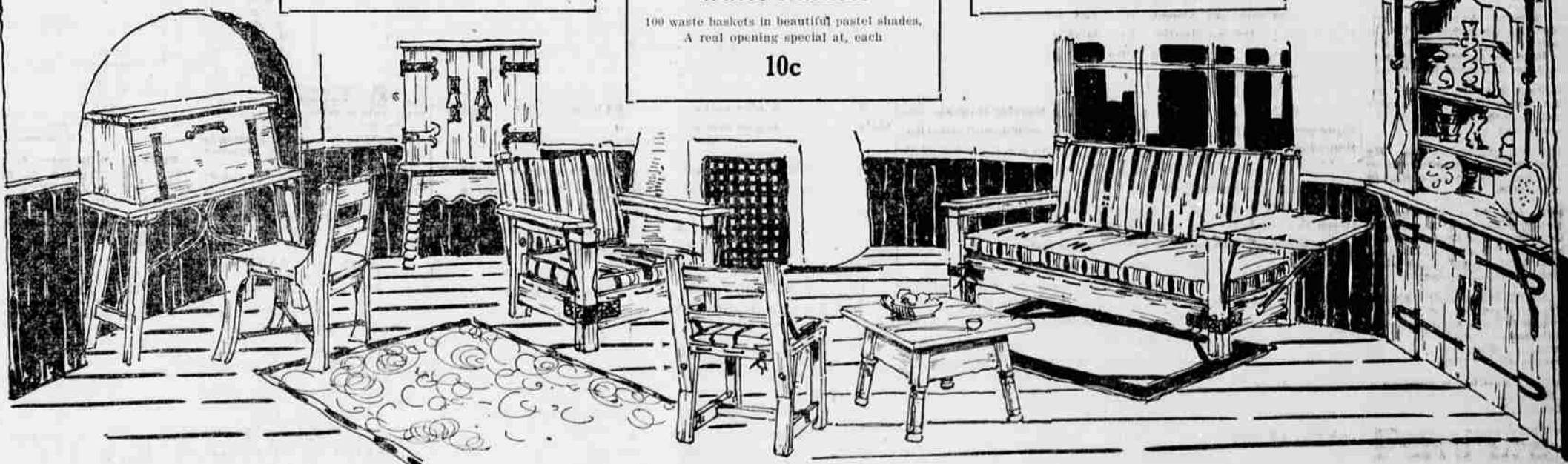
