

# WOMEN TO ENTERTAIN FAIR PILOT

Miss Edith Foltz, One of Seven Women in Air Tour Party Will Be Guest of Medford Business Women Monday Afternoon.

Miss Edith Foltz, one of the seven women pilots in the United States to hold transport licenses, and winner in important air races last year, will be entertained by the local Business and Professional Women's club, while in this city with the Pacific Northwest Air Tour, which will land at the Medford field Monday afternoon to be greeted by a gigantic celebration, sponsored by the Medford post, American Legion and official dedication of the Medford airport.

This daring young pilot is an honorary member of the Vancouver Business and Professional Women's club and a letter was received by Mrs. Maud Chapman, local president, today, from the secretary of the northern club informing the Medford group of her participation in the flight.

Miss Foltz will pilot a light plane and give a short exhibition of stunting. She is remembered here by all members of the Medford club who attended the regional conference of Business and Professional Women's Clubs held at Seaside during early summer.

Final details of the celebration and dedication program were completed today at the meeting of the committee at the Hotel Medford. The complete program will be announced in the Sunday Medford Mail Tribune. Tickets for the events are now on sale at the Chamber of Commerce building and all persons planning to attend are urged to get tickets early to avoid congestion at the gate.

The first event Monday will be the flight of mail planes from the field at 7:30 and 9:30 a. m. carrying between 5000 and 10,000 letters bearing the special dedication flight cachet to all sections of the United States.

Arrive About 3 P. M. The planes of the Northwest Air Tour, numbering between 35 and 40, will leave Springfield at 10 o'clock and arrive at the Medford field between 2:45 and 3:15 p. m. The air show will be put on immediately by Tex Rankin, Dorothy Hooper, Gordon Mounce and Floyd Keadle, stunt fliers, with special parachute drops by Frank Brooks.

The air show will continue until 5:00 o'clock and the banquet to have been held at the Hotel Medford at this hour has been postponed because of the limitation of time. The members of the tour will be guests of the chamber of commerce at dinner.

At 7:15 p. m. a concert will be given by the Elks band in the Hangar building. It will be followed by the formal dedication program, arranged by the city airport committee, headed by J. O. Grey. The program will be followed by numerous addresses and the first official flight from the field in the Standard of California, trimotored Ford plane. Members of the official flight party will be announced later.

Between 8:00 and 9:00 o'clock there will be a series of exhibition flights and stunts followed by the dedication dance. All details of handling the crowds and traffic have been completed. There will be plenty of parking space and traffic will be handled by a special squadron from the state traffic force in charge of Lieut. O. O. Nichols.

# NEW RAILROAD MOVE ON BAY MEETS FAVOR

Western Pacific Plan to Build Line Around San Francisco Harbor Approved Despite S. P.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—(AP)—Another step toward new railroad entrances for San Francisco came today in a favorable report to the interstate commerce commission on the plan of the Western Pacific railroad to build an all-rail line around San Francisco bay.

The Western Pacific project is closely associated with the plan already approved by the commission, under which the Great Northern railroad will build down from the north and in combination with the Western Pacific will open new transcontinental routes into California territory.

The Western Pacific to complete the extension program asked the commission to let it parallel the Southern Pacific line which runs around San Francisco bay at present. O. D. Weed, a commission examiner who investigated the proposals, and recorded the strenuous opposition of the Southern Pacific and the Santa Fe, advised the commission to grant the Western Pacific a practically full sanction for its entire extension.
