SOUTHERN OREGON PIONEER JOURNEY TO CRATER LAKE

CRATER LAKE, Ore., Aug. 2.—(Sp.)—Two old-time residents honored Crater Lake national park during the past week by motoring with a party of friends. They were Rev. Father H. J. McDevitt, rector of the church at Brevoort, Ore., and Capt. O. C. Applegate of Klamath Falls.

Father McDevitt, 80, has just returned from Tunis, Africa, whither he journeyed to attend the Eucharist congress. He spent some time in Rome and, on his way back to the United States, visited the ancestral residence of his family in Ireland. On taking up work as a missionary priest, after the completion of his education in the Vatican college at Rome, he was assigned to what was probably the largest territory in America, if not in the world. He was located at Burns, Ore., and his territory included 26,000 square miles, covering southeastern Oregon, northwestern Nevada and northeastern California.

Captain Applegate, head of the Association of Indian War Veterans, is best known as chief of scouts in the Modoc war. The captain is one of the oldest friends that Crater Lake national park has, having first visited the lake in 1869.
