Special Recipes

Banana Butter, for Cake Fillings
Ingredients: 3 cups (1 1/2 lbs.) banana pulp; juice of 1 lemon; 6 1/2 cups (2 1/2 lbs.) sugar; 1 bottle pectin; 1 teaspoon butter;
Use only mellow ripe bananas. Crush to a fine pulp. Put crushed fruit into large kettle, and add sugar, butter, and lemon juice. Mix and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. At once add pectin, stirring constantly and bring again to a full rolling boil. Boil 4 minutes, stirring constantly over entire bottom before and while boiling to prevent sticking. Remove from fire, and stir frequently for 3 minutes to cool slightly, to prevent floating fruit. Pour quickly. Cover hot butter with film of hot paraffin; when butter is cold, cover with 1/4 inch of hot paraffin. Roll glass to spread paraffin on sides. Sometimes sets very slowly. Requires 8 to 12 bananas. Makes 9 to 10 eight-ounce glasses.

Jellied Baked Apples
Bake apples in usual way. About ten minutes before they are done, remove from oven and fill centers with raisin jam. When filled, return apples to oven and complete the baking. Serve hot or cold, with or without cream.

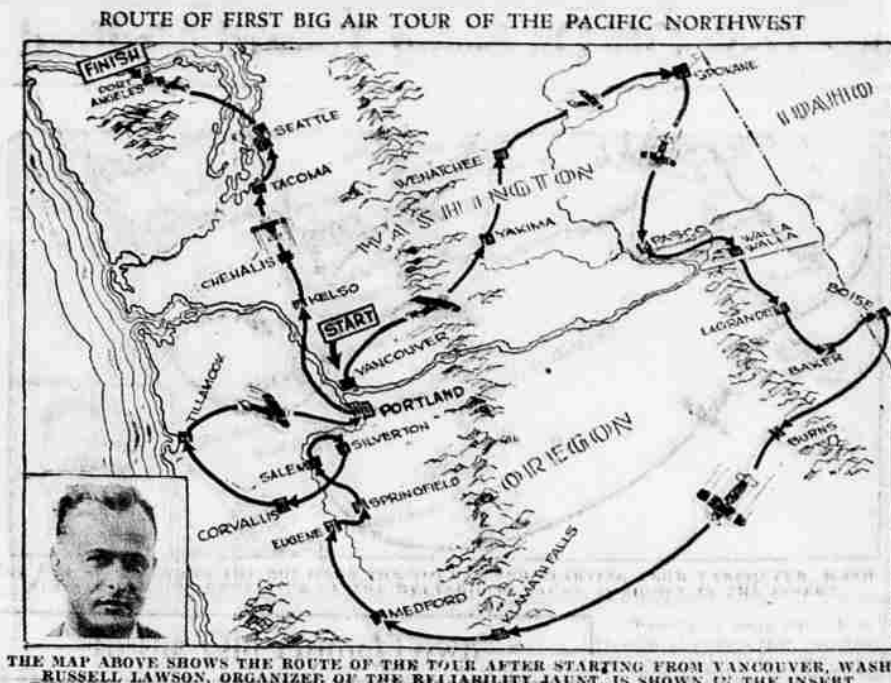
Carrot Marmalade
Ingredients: 4 cups (2 lbs.) citrus mixture and cooked, finely chopped carrots; 1/2 cup pectin; 6 1/2 cups (2 1/2 lbs.) sugar;
Peel orange and dice, discarding hard core and seeds. Mix with grated rinds, lemon juice and finely chopped carrots. Measure citrus and carrot mixture into large kettle. Add sugar, mix, and bring to a full rolling boil over hottest fire. Stir constantly before and while boiling. Roll glass to spread paraffin on sides. Sometimes sets very slowly. Requires about 2 pounds carrots, 2 lemons, and 1 orange. Makes about 9 eight-ounce glasses.

Blackberry Jelly
Ingredients: 4 cups (2 lbs.) juice; 1 bottle pectin; 7 1/2 cups (3 1/4 lbs.) sugar;
Use only fully ripened berries. Crush thoroughly and drip through jelly bag. Do not drip over night as uncooked juices ferments quickly. Measure juice and sugar into large saucepan, mix and bring to a boil. At once add pectin, stirring constantly, and bring again to full rolling boil and boil 1/2 minute. Remove from fire, let stand 1 minute, skim, pour quickly. Cover hot jelly with film of hot paraffin; when jelly is cold cover with 1/4 inch of hot paraffin. Roll glass to spread paraffin on sides. Requires about 3 quarts berries. Makes about 11 eight-ounce glasses.

Sliced Strawberry Jam
Ingredients: 4 1/2 quarts packed cups (2 lbs.) sliced berries; 1/2 cup bottled pectin; 7 cups (3 lbs.) sugar;
Use only full ripened berries. Cut small or medium berries in halves lengthwise; large berries in quarters. Measure berries and sugar into large kettle, mix and bring to a full rolling boil over hottest fire. Stir constantly before and while boiling. Roll glass to spread paraffin on sides. Sometimes sets very slowly. Requires about 2 quarts berries. Makes 9 to 10 eight-ounce glasses.

In the Old Home Town

(Kansas City Star)
Those of us who lived many years ago in the Old Home Town will recall the houses that were built on a hillside. The lower floor of each house formed the basement, which was the kitchen and dining room, and opened out on the lower ground level. The front entrance to these houses were on the higher ground level, and on this level were the living rooms, and the stairway to the bedroom floors above led up from this second ground level. What has become of these old houses? In recent years they seem to have disappeared almost entirely.
One we remember distinctly as it stood back on Elm street, though not many of the old-timers knew it was Elm street. For in the Old Home Town in that day the streets were known by the names of the most prominent families that lived on them. In that good old day Elm street was known as "the street that runs down past the Wright place." Bridge street, for instance, was called by that name only down in the very heart of the business district, and small business district, too, and just before it emptied into the bridge that spanned the river. Out from the downtown district it was known as "the street that runs out by the Dr. Strickling place."
But it is the Wright home we recall so well. A stone house, it was, with its neat little front door and front porch on the sidewalk level, and its back door opening out from the basement kitchen on a lower ground level. In the Wright home there was a little winding stairway from the kitchen and dining room to the living rooms. That was an extra touch to its architecture. Indeed, almost everything about that home, where, we hope, "Auntie" Wright still lives, showed an extra touch of the building art of that day. For Mr. Wright was a carpenter and ran the first planing mill in the Old Home Town. They were English; they came from England, in fact, in one of the old-time sail boats. And they were true Britons.
The house was not the only thing that stamped the Wrights as being the natives of the Old Home Town called "quaker." They were Episcopalians. In the Old Home Town a member of the Episcopal church was regarded as being next to a sensation, when he got into the Old Home Town, as stated many times before, were Methodists of the old school — shouting Methodists — and Mr.

Para: The Jungle City

WASHINGTON (AP)—Aug. 3.—From the air we saw how close primeval forests crowd Para. Its streets end in the jungle.
Flying from Washington to Buenos Aires, the National Geographic Society's aerial survey party stopped at Para five days to overhaul the plane. Frederick Simpich writes of the greatest city on the Amazon as follows: "When we got ashore, we felt how utterly the vast forests of Brazil dominate the life of this greatest city on the Amazon.
"Yet Para lives on the jungle. The big woods give it Brazil nut rubber, hardwoods, fruit, waxes, oils and jungle-bred animals, on which its life is based.
"Animals Forage in Picnic Grounds
"In equatorial dawn and dusk Para smells of jungle. Its beautiful natural jungle, cut with paths and set with man's kiosks, swings, benches and handstands — where after nightfall big jungle bats dart about, and smaller jungle animals forage for food in the wake of day-time picnics.
"Giant mango trees, peited with noise by small boys when in fruit, shade the wide, cobble-stoned streets of its better quarters. On its water front streets you smell smoked, crude rubber, the half-pineapples, piles of Brazil nuts ready for ships to New York or Liverpool; for British Isle coal miners munch them while at work — bags of cocoa, piles of squarish logs with their ends painted, and you smell the fresh-cut firewood half-breed Indians are stacking for use of wood-burning river boats.
"Monkeys, Macaws and Jaguars
"You smell also the shop of the wild animal dealer. Its front gaily painted with a Noah's Ark group of jungle creatures. He shows you bright, shrill macaws, grotesque monkeys, and snarling jaguars. Then there are ant-eaters, living now, not on ants, but on fresh eggs broken into a dish; and cunning little capivara, or river pigs; and the pink fish, the stock, a white owl in a black mask, rare GREYS, multi-colored wild ducks, also an "electric eel" which gives you a distinct shock, allegedly 40 volts or more, when you stick a wire into this water barrel and touch him.
