ITALY SEES CORSICA AS AID IN WAR

Agitation Grows for Return of Mediterranean Isle to Italian Flag—Anti-French Seed Sown Among War-like Inhabitants.

By Andree Berding, Associated Press Staff Writer. LEGHORN, Italy.—(AP)—Deep significance attaches to a tour of the island of Corsica, birthplace of Napoleon, just made by the Italian Automobile club. For a growing agitation is arising in Italy crying that Corsica is Italian historically and ethnologically, and must return to Italy, whether by treaty or by war. Corsica, Nice and Tunis would be in immediate dispute between France and Italy if war, always urged by certain sections of both nations, develops. And the prospect of gaining or losing these three possessions might well bring on a war.

The Italian Automobile club members reported on their return to Italy, that the Corsicans were still Italians in habit, speech and way of view, but that the men, being Corsicans and therefore war-like, were flocking into the French army in hopes of military preferment.

The newspapers of Italy have not been permitted to comment on the political side of the tour, in which scores of automobiles took part. But there is little popular doubt that its organizers intended to convince the Corsicans, by means of the excursion, that Italians still had them in mind and would come to their assistance in time of trouble.

Book Offers Proof. At this moment of writing, a book has been published in Rome by the Italian publicist Nino D'Arroma, called "Corsica and Italy." In it D'Arroma seeks to prove that the island should belong to Italy.

Corsica, third island of the Mediterranean in size, coming immediately after Sicily and Sardinia, is of great strategic importance to whichever of the two countries possesses it. For France it would serve beautifully for bases from which to attack a vital section of the Italian coast. This section includes Genoa, busiest port in the Mediterranean; Spezia, with important shipbuilding and naval yards; Leghorn, also important as a shipbuilding center; picturesque little Pisa, Orsetto and Grosseto.

Strategic Location. Just off the coast is the island of Elba, Napoleon's place of exile, only 150 miles away. And just south of Corsica is the Italian island of Sardinia, from which the Italian kings derived their title.

In the Italo-Turkish war of 1912, when friction between France and Italy arose over Italy's seizure of some French ships, France massed troops and warships in Corsica, and then proceeded to overrun Sardinia from Corsica. The ship seizures stopped.

Corsica has been French property since 1788. Previously, for

468 years, it belonged to Genoa. The Italian city sold it to France about the time of the birth of Napoleon in Ajaccio, so that some dispute has arisen as to whether Napoleon was born an Italian or a Frenchman. It is recalled, however, that Napoleon, a Corsican, spoke of Italy as his native land when he made his first Italian invasion. Now the island has a population of 37,000.

CAPTAIN HAWKS IN WEST-EAST FLIGHT RECORD

Continent Crossed in 14 Hours, 50 Minutes—Average 179 Miles Per Hour—Encounter Storms.

LOS ANGELES, Aug. 7.—(AP)—Frank Hawks, Los Angeles aviator, today holds the record for the



Capt. Frank Hawks, quickest westward crossing of the United States. Flying at an average speed of 179 miles per hour, Hawks yesterday drove his low-wing monoplane from Curtis field, New York, to Municipal airport, Los Angeles, in 14 hours, 50 minutes, and 43 seconds. It was the first time a transcontinental flight had been made in full daylight. The Greyhound plane touched the ground here at 4:50:43 p. m., P. S. T., after leaving New York at 5 a. m., E. S. T.

Hawks lowered by three hours, 52 minutes the recent east-west record set by Roscoe Turner. Hawks made refueling stops at Columbus, O.; St. Louis, Wichita, Kans.; Albuquerque, N. M.; and Kingman, Ariz. Turner made but one stop on his flight.

Stormy weather was encountered by the former instructor at the army flying school, Brooks field, Texas, during most of the 2,600 miles he flew. Rains were encountered between Pittsburgh, Pa., and Terre Haute, Ind., and severe storms from Albuquerque to the Arizona-California border.

Subtracting the time taken for the five stops, Hawks actually flew across the country in 13 hours and 35 minutes, 43 seconds.

About 200 aviation enthusiasts hailed Hawks as he flashed across the finish line at better than 200 miles per hour. Mr. and Mrs. Charles M. Hawks, the flyer's parents, and Turner were on hand.

Hawks said he was "tired and glad to get here," as he climbed from his plane. His father suggested a game of golf as they shook hands.

ON-TO-OREGON FUND DRIVE TO RAISE \$250,000

Portland Business Men Seek Subscriptions for Advertising Campaign—Large Sums Given.

PORTLAND, Aug. 7.—(SP)—Underwriting of the \$250,000 fund with which On-To-Oregon, Inc., will advertise Oregon's resources, advantages and opportunities to the world, is going forward steadily this week in Portland, under the direction of E. B. MacNaughton, vice-president of the First National bank.

With the 100 business men who are in the field seeking subscriptions all busy, directors of the association expressed confidence today that the \$100,000 needed to supplement the \$150,000 now on hand and bring the total up to \$250,000 will be obtained before the campaign closes August 9.

Due to the expense which would be incurred and the time which would be consumed in setting up numerous local organizations for the collection of funds in the several communities of the state, no attempt is being made to solicit subscriptions outside of Multnomah county this year. However, subscriptions from individuals and firms and corporations in communities outside of Portland will be welcomed, the directors said.

SMALL TOWN BANK PLUNDERED BY PAIR

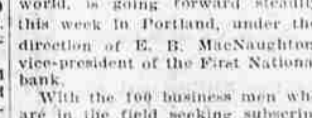

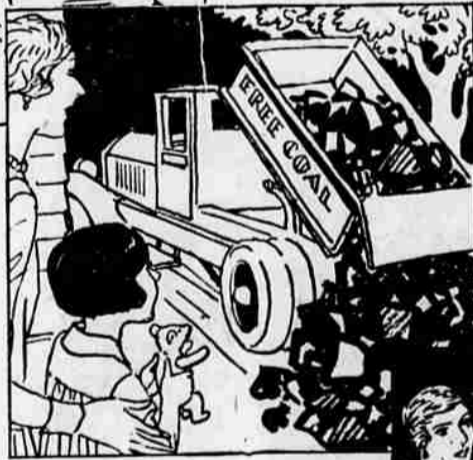

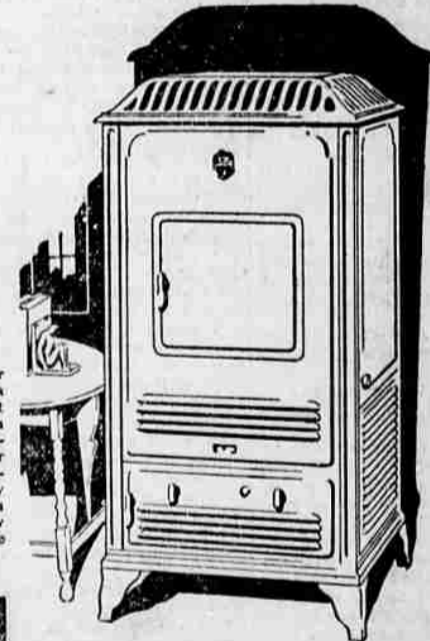
