

MILL MANAGER AND 2 WORKERS HELD FIREBUGS

CORVALLIS, Ore., Aug. 8.—(AP)—W. J. Merrick, manager of the Shanghai Lumber company mill, Devitt, Ore., western Benton county, which burned a week ago; R. H. Norton, employe, and M. L. Schuster, night watchman, were arrested today by Sheriff W. L. Newton on a charge of arson. Merrick posted \$5000 bonds for release.

The arrests followed an investigation by Sheriff Newton and State Fire Marshal deputies. Norton, authorities said, confessed setting the mill afire with kerosene. He is alleged to have told officials the kerosene refused to ignite and he later poured gasoline on sections of the mill.

Schuster, Sheriff Newton said, acted as guard. He is alleged to have told authorities Merrick engineered the plan. The lumber company carried \$25,000 insurance.

The three men were escorted with the district attorney today.

TWO DIE, 29 HURT ARIZONA WRECK

WINSLOW, Ariz., Aug. 8.—(AP)—R. E. Bixby, 42, engineer, and M. E. Burney, 41, fireman, were killed and 29 passengers were slightly injured when the engine and two cars of Santa Fe passenger train No. 8 plunged into the Little Colorado river one mile east of Joseph City, Ariz., last night. A checkup today by railroad officials showed that none of the passengers was hurt seriously.

IOWA VIGILANTE SLAIN BY THUGS

TIPTON, Ia., Aug. 8.—(AP)—R. G. Sprout, prominent business man and Cedar county vigilante, was shot and killed by three robbers today.

Sprout was in ambush with sheriff C. H. Elwood, and John Carey awaiting the men who had held up a drug store at Davenport an hour and a half earlier.

The vigilantes attempted to stop the robbers' car, but its occupants began firing. Sprout was hit three times.

'TIP OFF MAN' DETROIT GANG SLAYING HELD

Angelo Livecchio Identified and Four Killers Named in Radio Announcer Murder—Police Give No Motive for Crime.

DETROIT, Aug. 8.—(AP)—Angelo Livecchio, charged with first degree murder in the slaying of Radio Announcer Jerry Buckley, July 23, was identified by a taxi driver today as the man who pointed Buckley out to his killers.

Livecchio was held for trial without bond by Recorder's Judge John V. Brennan. No date was set.

Gus Reno, whose taxi stand was at the La Salle hotel, in which Buckley was killed, identified Livecchio as the man who emerged from the Adelaide street entrance and talked to some men loitering nearby. He said that later Livecchio came out and signaled to the men to enter. A few seconds later Reno said he heard shots.

Elmer Jolley, house detective at the hotel, identified Livecchio as the man whom he saw acting suspiciously in the lobby shortly before the shooting.

The Detroit News today quoted Police Commissioner Thomas C. Wilcox as saying two of the four gangsters sought as the killers of Radio Announcer Jerry Buckley were among the four men who January 2 shot and seriously wounded Inspector Henry J. Garvin.

Police officials today named five men as involved in the killing of Buckley. All are known as gangsters.

One of them is under arrest and was docketed for arraignment today on a murder charge. He is Angelo Livecchio, whom police accuse of pointing out Buckley to the slayers. The other suspects listed are Thomas (Yummy) Llea-voli, Ted Pizzino, Mike Morgany and Frank Cammarata.

In making public these names, Commissioner Wilcox and his ranking officers made no statement as to what they believe was the motive for the crime. Plans were made to broadcast pictures and description of the men.

COAST MILLMEN HEAR PLAN FOR TRADE INCREASE

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 8.—(AP)—Two hundred Pacific northwest lumbermen today heard A. C. Dixon, Eugene, Ore., national lumber manufacturers' association president, and W. F. Shaw, trade extension manager, outline further activities for business extension.

Dixon gave a lengthy report at the semi-annual conference of the national association and the West Coast Lumbermen's association.

Resolutions of regret were passed for the death of George S. Long, vice president and general manager of the Weyerhaeuser Timber company, who was an active association worker.

Dr. Wilson Compton, Washington, D. C., secretary manager of the national organization, was to discuss the Russian pulpwood situation at tonight's banquet.

ABATE A STENCH ON STATE ORDERS

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 8.—(AP)—To eliminate the disagreeable odor from the state sewer emptying into the Willamette River on Center street, the state board of control today ordered the extension of the sewer outlet a distance of 25 feet and that it be submerged three feet under water. At present the state sewer, like several of the city sewers, is above water, with the result that the odor has been declared by Dr. Frederick D. Stricker, state health officer, and by the county health department as a nuisance and as unsanitary.

The odor from the state's sewer is practically all from flax wastage that goes into the sewer at the penitentiary.

ANTLERED DOE IS SLAIN BY HUNTER

SAN JOSE, Cal., Aug. 8.—(AP)—Subject to technical arrest for killing a doe, Leslie L. McClay was pondering on the whimsies of nature today.

McClay brought down a 150-pound deer, with 15-inch antlers, with a 15-inch spread and two points on each side. Imagine his embarrassment when he discovered a male impersonator dead.

The fish and game commission was quoted as saying action against the hunter was unlikely. It was the first time in the section that a doe with antlers had been brought down.

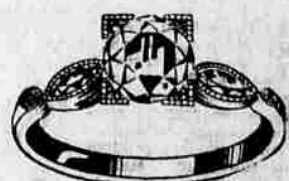

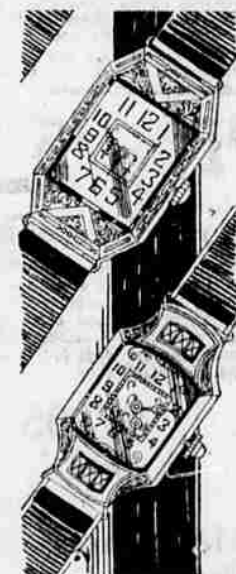

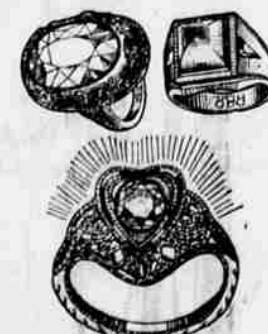
