INLAND EMPIRE SIZZLES AT 100

SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 8.—(AP)—Old Sol stacked a new heat record at 2 p. m. here today for the count of 100 degrees, and was still going strong. It was the hottest day of the year here.

Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, had 105, Lewiston had 113 and Sand Point 99.5. In east Washington, Pasco was cool at 90 degrees, while Riparia had a mere 100. It was 110 there yesterday.

A survey by the Chronicle showed Inland Empire wheat little affected by the drought, the paper said, with wheat in the Palouse section of east Washington and north Idaho about ready to thresh 40 bushels to the acre.

PAY FOR PICKERS SHOWS DECREASE; NEW PARKING RULE

The present prices paid for fruit picking return on the average 25 cents an hour for men and 30 cents per hour for women, according to information obtained today from the local branch of the government farm employment bureau, located in the Chamber of Commerce building. These amounts are lower than paid in past years, but pickers are considering themselves fortunate to find employment at that pay.

Despite the fact that fruit picking is going into full swing, there is still a big labor surplus, including considerable labor that is considered incompetent, it is said. After next Monday, no cars will be allowed to park for longer than ten minutes on South Fir street in the fruit packing district, City Traffic Chief George Prescott announced today.
