Russia to Refurnish "Red Square"

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 9.—Russia is to refurnish her famous "Red Square" in Moscow. Already the work of turning the temporary wooden museum of Lenin into a permanent resting place of stone is under way behind a high wooden fence. The ancient cobble stones are to be removed and replaced by smooth flag stones. Permanent viewing stands are to be erected. A bulletin from the Washington, D. C., headquarters of the National Geographic society tells of typical scenes in this "pulsing heart of Russia."

which occur in the 1950-mile-long San Francisco river at a point about 120 miles upstream from its mouth. No plane ever flew there before. Here an estimated horsepower of 1,200,000 makes a great roar. The gorges and canyons, through which the great river drops 250 or 275 feet in a series of falls, are comparable in grandeur and vivid rock coloration to sections of the Grand Canyon of the Colorado. Recalls One Old South "Life on Brazilian sugar estates recalls ante-bellum tales of our own old South. The owners, usually with French culture, live an easy, baronial existence. Though in Brazil, most farm work is still done with hand tools, the day of the machine is come. From little towns like Macieira new roads split the jungles—as yet mud or dust roads—but a beginning. In the last two years, on these new roads the Yankee-built motor bus has made its mark. The bus carries a warning. Then all the people from the coconut groves come running."

Flying Down Longest Coconut Grove

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 9.—"Almost tripping the nuts of coconut trees with our wing up, we circled low over this undulating palm belt which stretches hundreds of miles down the Brazilian coast, to let our cameras record its odd sights," writes Frederick Simplic, National Geographic Society staff correspondent with the seaplane party surveying air routes between Washington and Buenos Aires.

"Thatched-but dwellers in this world's longest orchard," broken only to wand then by barren spots, towers or river mouths, seem to live largely on coconuts and fish. "Sliding swiftly ashore in the surf, their day's fishing done, is a fleet of jaguandás, or the queer sailing rafts of spiced logs seen here by the hundreds. The first I saw, miles from shore with its deck awash and two men standing ankle-deep in water on it, gave me quite a start: I thought the men drift from a ship wrecked."

"At low tide the hard sandy beach makes the local highway between villages. A thin traffic stream trickles over it. We see many ox teams, six and eight yokes to a team, hauling the big country cars, their clumsy wheels one solid piece of wood. One day, ashore, I heard the hideous scream of such a cart, as its dry axle squeaked under its heavy load. "Why don't they grease it?" I asked. "They pull better when the cart squeaks."

"As auto tourists roam the States, getting gas here and there, and lodging where night falls, so we are touring by seaplane. Across the West Indian island bridge, around the Orinoco delta, into Amazonia, poking into odd nooks and coastal crannies and roaming freely over shallow waters behind the reefs we visit many strange spots. "Landing at little towns, flying up occasional rivers where no planes are seen, or visiting big plantations, we get a fresh, intimate close-up of country life in parts of Brazil where Americans are seldom seen.
