CURB PLACED ON ZEALOUS AIDES. BALTIMORE, Aug. 9.—(AP)—The promise that prohibition agents who halt motorists without adequate reason to believe the law is being violated, will be held to strict accountability, is made in a letter made public today, from Amos W.
