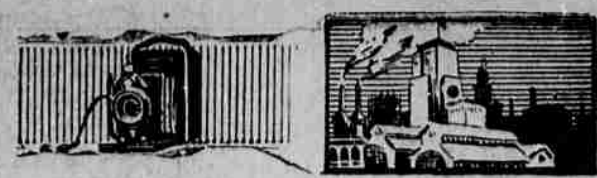


CAMERAGRAMS

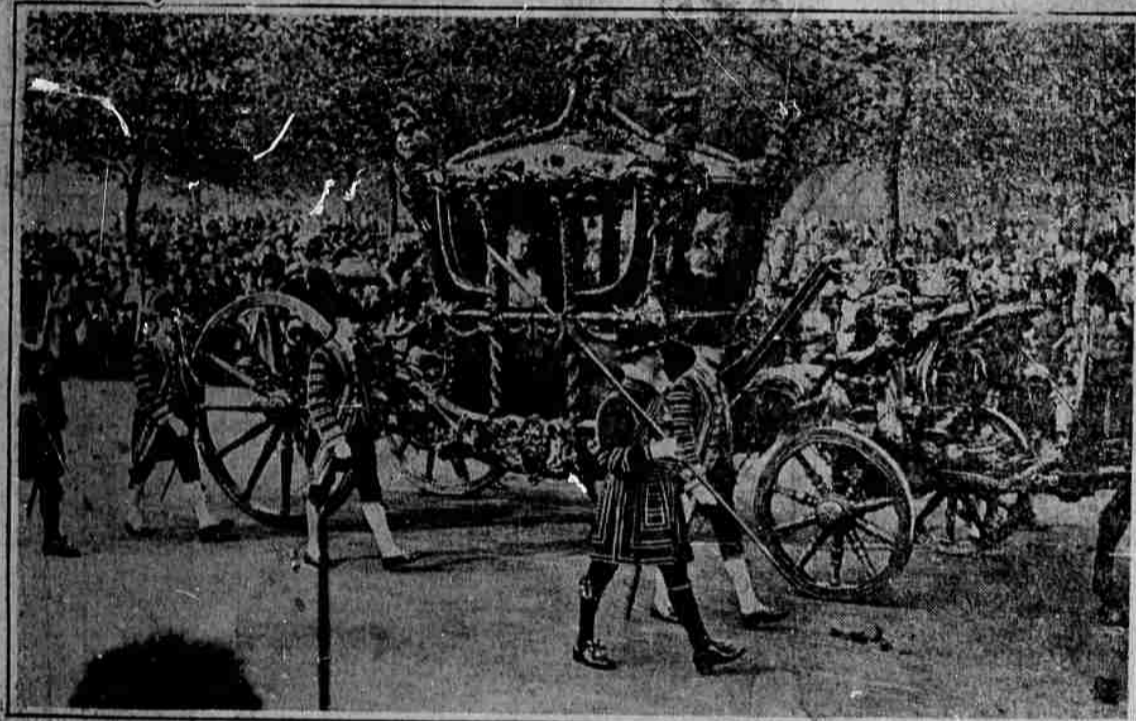

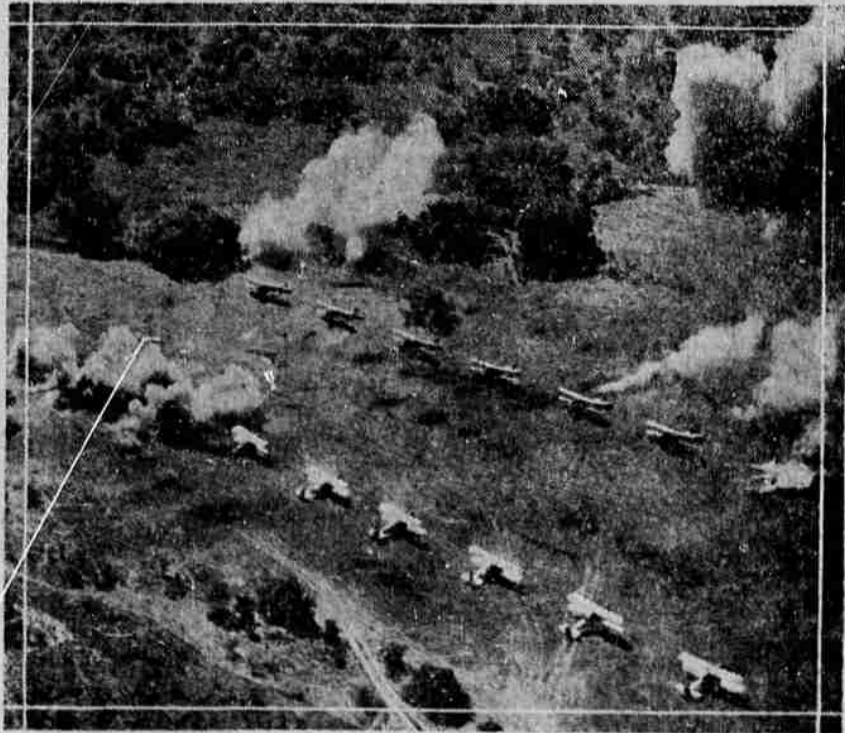
