NOVEMBER CLOSE YIELDS NO SIGN OF YULE TRADING

NEW YORK, Nov. 29.—(AP)—The stock market put a dismal November behind it today and made ready to welcome any pickup in trade incident to Christmas.

Prices closed a point higher on the average, largely because professional traders chose to settle some accounts for the week-end, but the dullness of the two-hour session prevented the market from giving a very clear picture of its intentions for the immediate future.

Starting with a small decline in the course of which a few rails added a point or two to yesterday's losses, the list became firm as it went into the second hour and final prices were generally the best of the day, thanks to covering. Carrier shares responded with the others and the merchandising issues, particularly Saturday's performance by displacing group strength. This time with Woodworth as the leader.

Net gains of 1 to 2 points were liberally sprinkled through the active stocks. In this range fell U. S. Steel, American Telephone, American Can, Westinghouse, Pennsylvania, New York Central, Pennsylvania, New Haven, Allied Chemical, Gillette, Consolidated Gas, North American, Goodyear Rubber, Johns-Manville and others. Atchison converted a 3-point break into a net advance of 1 1/2. Union Pacific more than recovered a two-point drop, but lost part of the rally.

Corn was strong on a bullish weather forecast and an improved eastern cash demand. Wheat, steady, was virtually unchanged at the close, while cotton rose one to four points.

The usual Saturday dullness was experienced in foreign exchange, Canadian dollars continued to sink.

COOS BAY MILLS CUT PRODUCTION

C. YEN'S BROTHER OF COLORADO TO MAKE HOME HERE

Medford has another welcome newcomer to the city's permanent population, a musician and embryo lawyer in the person of Victor A. Tengwald of Denver, Colo., who arrived here last Monday night and who will be associated with his brother, Carl Y. Tengwald in the latter's insurance and real estate business—at least until he takes the Oregon state bar examination next July, after which he expects to begin practice here.

Victor not only has more hair on his head than Carl but is a blame right better looking, and is ten years younger than him. In fact he is a welcome brace-up to the general pulchritude of Medford young men. Of course, girls, he is single.

Then, too, he is just as modest as Carl is—now what the writer intended to state is that Victor during his short life has had a varied experience which few young men enjoy. Seal History

The Christmas seal is proud of its family tree. And, like many people, it traces its ancestry back to the old country.

One Christmas eve a postal clerk in Holland, Einar Halbaell, was busily engaged in sorting mail. As he passed over the many letters and packages his train of thought was on the small cost of the stamps and he reasoned that maybe people would be willing to spend a little money for stamps for tuberculosis children. Next year the idea was executed and a health message was started which has traveled through all the post-offices of the land.

Miss Emily Bissell, a Red Cross worker, was interested in a small tuberculosis sanitarium. She read about this Danish postman and from that started the idea herself.

The next year the American Red Cross carried on the enterprise on a nationwide plan. From 3000 in 1907 the sales grew to 300,000 in 1919, and to over 5,000,000 in 1927. The decrease in tuberculosis in the United States is in direct ratio to the money raised.
