PORTLAND BUTTER QUOTATIONS HELD UNTRUE ON COAST

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 2.—(AP) Butter quotations opened steady today. Some dealers reported stronger receipts. There was some price shading. With beginning of the week the Portland office of the department of agricultural economics ceased to recognize butter quotations of the Portland market reports on grounds that the exchange quotations are unrepresentative of true conditions in the market.

Egg market was fully steady with both receipts and demand slightly increased.

Local truck crops continue to be harvested in liberal volume, with little or no frost damage yet.

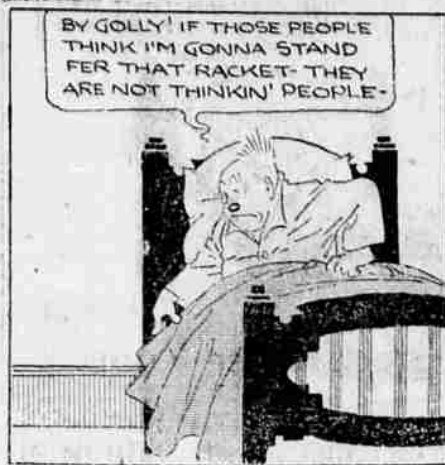
