## IRELAND GETS READY TO VOTE DURING SPRING

### Leaders Would Avoid Political Strife During Hugg Eucharistic Congress in 1932.

DUBLIN.—(AP)—The impression of a "hug" in the Free State that is expected to be expected only next year.

The time of the "hug" expires in 1932, but the year will see the first Eucharistic congress in the history of the Free State.

The government party is willing to accept any party that can prove its claim to a tariff commission composed of civil servants.

The government has now made the commission a whole-time job, and its chairman will be the permanent secretary of the ministry of justice.

### PARIS PUTS QUETUS ON JAZZ BANDS FROM AMERICAN CAMPUSES

PARIS.—(AP)—The French capital will not open its arms to American college jazz bands next summer as it has been doing.

The talkies are forcing the musicians' union to tighten up on restrictions applying to foreigners.

Three hundred native players were put out of jobs recently in one day. Simultaneously, police began to demand working permits from foreign orchestras in night clubs and chic restaurants, and several were forced to leave the country.

French musicians say that the college jazz bands arrive in the summer, having "played" their way across the ocean liners. They are assured return passage by the steamship companies for the entertainment they give paying passengers.

But between crossings they invade Paris and in order to make expenses offer their services at low prices.

### WILD TURKEYS PROSPER UNDER FEDERAL CARE

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—Bronze and green wild turkeys, the kind which adorned Thanksgiving platters of the Pilgrim fathers, have come under Uncle Sam's protection.

The turkeys have been given homes in several of the national forests.

Thus cared for, the big gobblers are increasing in the national forests of New Mexico and Arizona.

In the Wichita national forest in Oklahoma, wild turkeys have a range of 25,000 acres, shared chiefly with wild deer.

Wild turkeys are found in small numbers in wooded mountain districts of Virginia and North Carolina. Alabama and Texas have the most numerous flocks.

### FOREIGNERS BUILD PLANES FOR CHILE

SANTIAGO, Chile.—(AP)—The first foreign airplane factory built by American aviation interests has been completed here, and work started on its first order of 40 military planes for the Chilean air corps.

During construction of the plant by the Curtiss-Wright export corporation 25 Chilean engineers received instruction at the company's military aircraft factory in Buffalo, N. Y.

They will form the nucleus of the staff, which will be made up of native Chilean labor, though a small group of resident American engineers will supervise plane production.

All the planes on order are military observation ships, but the government contract stipulated that one-half of the order may be changed later to pursuit ships.

### LITTLE RED HEN LAYS 345 EGGS IN 365 DAYS

ALBUQUERQUE, Ala.—(AP)—Alabama has a new champion in a little red hen.

Officials of the Alabama Polytechnic Institute say "Lady Peasecock," a Rhode Island Red, has completed tests giving her a record nesting all others.

She has laid 345 eggs in a 365-day period, setting her four eggs ahead of the previous world's record of 341 eggs for her breed.

Lady Peasecock is 19 months old, she began laying a few days before the contest.

### WILLIAMS REVIVALIST MOVES ON TO PROVOLT

### W. VIRGINIA WESLEYAN HAS GALLOPING GHOST

BUCKHANNON, W. Va., (AP)—West Virginia Wesleyan fans hail their star halfback, Clifford Battles, as the 1930 "galloping ghost of the aridron."

Six times he has broken loose for touchdown runs of 65 yards or more.

He sprinted 46 yards and over New York University's goal line, and 66 and 88 yards.

Against the opposition of Wayneburg of Pennsylvania he clocked off gallops of 97, 96 and 89 yards.

## GOLD MINES OF WALES MAY BE REOPENED SOON

### Abandoned Workings Hold Rich Prospect for Modern Methods Belief, After Investigation.

Cly Tom Withelm, Dolgelly, Wales (AP)—Crisp miners "tried" from the creeks' literally heaped testimony before Professor Louis who is conducting an investigation of abandoned Welsh goldfields preparatory to submitting a report to the government.

Should the report be favorable, Welsh gold mining, for almost a generation abandoned, will blossom again.

Heard on a huge table in front of Professor Louis were gold nuggets, gold bearing quartz, gold ore and panned flake gold, all taken from the Welsh veins.

When the hearing ended, Professor Louis toured the abandoned workings accompanied by experts who estimated the amount of capital necessary to revive the industry.

One of the most picturesque of the old time miners to testify was Ellis Jones who attributed the falling off of gold production to poor milling methods.

Three fellows and myself, Jones told Professor Louis, "went into a shaft near here in the dead of winter and by heating water a little at a time we warmed enough gold out of the vein in a week to realize over \$800. Once, using what were then up to date operations \$25,000 in gold was taken from three tons of ore."

As a result of the disclosures, Wales is seething with gold fever, but none here has money enough to erect a modern mill where the ore could be properly and profitably worked.

However, several firms have announced their intentions of forming syndicates if the government investigation proves the venture feasible.

Welsh gold mines formerly built fortunes for their operators and gave employment to hundreds of workers. From the quartz beds at Bontddu, near Barnmouth, gold valued at \$10,000,000 was taken, smaller amounts being derived from other fields.

For brief spells in 1919 and 1922 the St. David mines here were opened and the wedding band worn by Princess Mary was cast from St. David gold, as was the ring of the Duchess of York.
