PREDICT DROP IN PORTLAND PRICE FOR EGGS SOON

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 10.—(P) Although wholesale egg quotations remained unchanged today, none of the market looked extremely weak, the main weakening factors being new price declines in New York, Chicago, Seattle, San Francisco and Los Angeles. Trade demand here remained slow while receipts continued liberal for a new price drop here.

Butter market was firm, prices steady, demand good and receipts rather light. Good tomatoes are firm, and Oregon hothouse extra fancy tomatoes advanced today. First Mexican tomatoes are now enroute to the northwest.

Kiln dried Porto Rican sweet potatoes from Texas are making their initial appearance, moving to jobbers at \$3.00-\$3.25 per 50-lb. crate. Quality is fine. Track sales of potatoes to Portland jobbers declined again, with U. S. No. 1 stock from all districts, Deschutes, Klamath and Yakima, quoted at \$1.25 per cwt.
