

LITTLE TROUT WILL COUNT IN ANGLERS' LIMIT

New Game Code Defines Conduct for Fisherman, Where Tiny Quarry Is Hooked—Bear Is Game.

PORTLAND, Dec. 11.—(P)—Under the re-codified game laws to be presented to the legislature in January, a trout is a trout whether it be three inches long or 10 inches. As such it will count in the bag limit of 30 fish.

Heretofore the small fish were tossed back into the stream where practically all died. An angler who handles a fish before he returns it to the water is subject to a fine of \$25—the maximum is \$500.
