## GROVER TALKS ON DAIRYMAN NEEDS BELLVIEW GRANGE

BELLVIEW, Ore., Dec. 19.—(Sp.)—Bellview Grange met in the club room, December 16.

Appointment of a special road committee to meet with the county court to discuss the expenditure of \$1600 of the 2 1/2 mill special levy fund in district No. 2, allotted to the Bellview district, was made by Grange Master G. A. Andrews.

Those appointed were Mark True, C. B. Lambkin and Roscoe Applegate, who will represent the Bellview residents in advising the most advantageous expenditure of the funds.

Discussion of dairy problems, more particularly the problem of increasing the use of butter through the elimination of butter substitutes, was led by Howard Grover of the Snider Dairy and Produce company of Medford, who approached his subject with a discussion of the dairy industry and what it means to the average farmer, providing a year-around income. He discussed ways and means of decreasing the sale of butter substitutes, mentioning the success in one community where merchants cooperated with dairymen—concentrated their advertising on the dairy products, and sold the substitutes only when they were asked for by customers.

The program arranged by Mrs. Vera True, lecturer for the Grange, opened with community singing and ended with a quartet number by Mr. and Mrs. G. A. Andrews, Mrs. Nell Dunn and A. L. Peachey, with Mrs. Fred Homes at the piano.

Good attendance featured the meeting, which is the last before the holiday season. At the first session in January a large class of candidates will take the first and second degree work of the Grange, which will be put on by the Bellview officers.
