

C-C TO LIST WORKERS ON SCHOOL

Registration Plan Will Insure Employment Local Labor—Call for Bids Expected Near January 10—Work Starts Feb. 1.

In order to facilitate an early start on the school building program, as overwhelmingly adopted by the voters at a bond issue election last Tuesday, the Chamber of Commerce will be asked by City School Superintendent E. H. Hedrick to take over the registration of applicants for work.

Many workers called at the school superintendent's office yesterday and today.

Applicants will be required to register, the questionnaire stating their age, length of residence in the city and county, married or single, number of children or dependents, and if they have any income.

The contractor will have the right of hiring and firing the workmen, with the restriction that all labor be local. This will be the strictest clause in the contract.

Registering labor at the Chamber of Commerce will lift a heavy burden of detail from the school authorities.

Bid Call in January.

It is expected that the call for bids will be made about January 10, and according to Frank C. Clark, supervising architect, actual construction work will start in the high school building about February 1st.

As much preliminary work as possible will be done, such as excavating, grading, etc. This morning plans were underway for digging the sewer system. Difficulty was experienced in locating the main sewer of that vicinity, the city making the search.

To speed up the drawing of the plans, Architect Clark will have most of the draughting done in Portland and will leave tomorrow to start the work. A force of eight draughtsmen will be put on the task and kept at it until finished.

Preliminary plans for the Oakdale street high school have been completed. The building will be constructed of steel and concrete, without a truss in the structure.

Gothic in Type.

The type of architecture will be modern Gothic, with a minimum of ornamentation. There will be two main entrances. The building will be fireproof throughout.

The building will contain a boys' gymnasium, with a seating capacity of 1100 people. The auditorium will have a seating capacity of 1200, slightly larger than any theater in the city. In these departments will be held basketball games, graduation exercises, high school plays, and all other school functions.

The oak trees on the site will be utilized in the landscaping of the school grounds, and there is ample space for parking and a high school athletic field.

It is expected to have the building completed and ready for occupancy by the opening of school next fall.

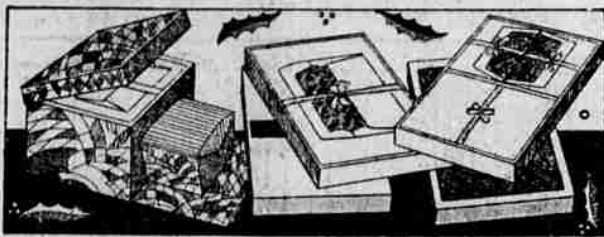

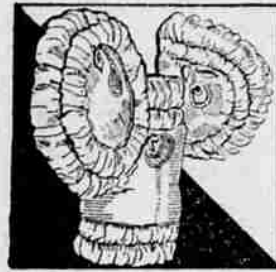
