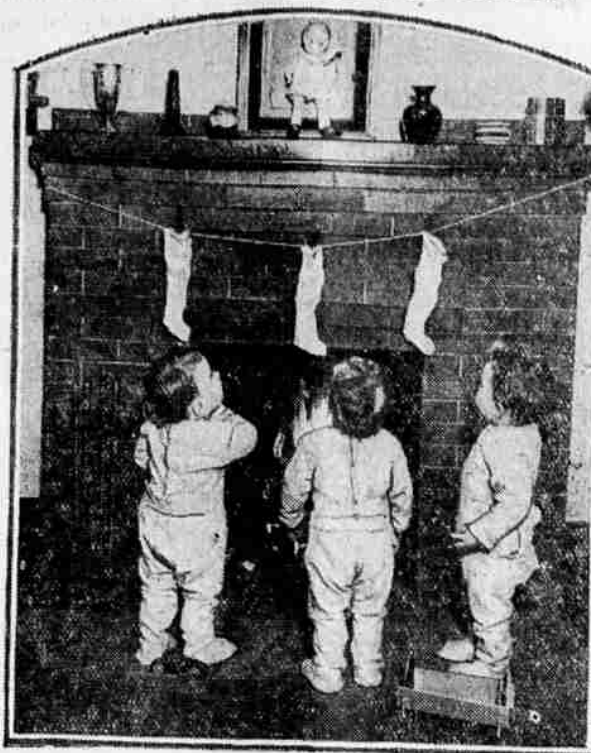
HOLLOPETER WINS LONG LITIGATION AGAINST C. PALM
