SEE NO SHORTAGE IN TURKEY SUPPLY

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 23.—(AP) Turkeys have been arriving in the Portland market since the beginning of the week in sufficient volume for the Christmas trade and dealers are predicting no last minute shortage will develop. City delivery prices to producers for No. 1 birds opened steady at 21 cents today excepting a few instances in which a cent more was paid to fill special orders. Old toms and No. 2 stock were quoted from 23 to 25 cents.
