LYNCHBURG, Va., Dec. 26.—(AP) Mrs. Katherine Clemmons Gould, estranged wife of Howard Gould, is dead. She was 56 years old.

She died Wednesday after an illness of several months at Blue Gap farm, near here, where she had lived for 15 years. Before her marriage in 1895, Mrs. Gould was an actress, known on the stage as Viola Katherine Clemmons.
