FLOUR PRICES CUT TO LOWEST POINT SINCE GREAT WAR

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 26.—(P) Flour prices in Portland, with a reduction of 20 cents a barrel, have dropped to \$5.80 for best grades, the lowest price since pre-war days, millers announced today.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 26.—(P) Wholesale dressed meat and poultry dealers held a considerable quantity of left-over Christmas turkeys today. Fresh receipts were light early and although early buyers inquired were also light buyers were not inclined to cut prices. Quote: No. 1 turkeys steady at 25.

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 26.—(P) Wholesale butter market opened 2 cents lower on extras at 30 cents a pound, standards at 29, prime first at 28 and 1 cent lower on firsts at 27 cents, to be in line with declining outside markets, but the market was firm as regards local demand. Creamery butterfat bid was down 3 cents to 27 cents delivered.
