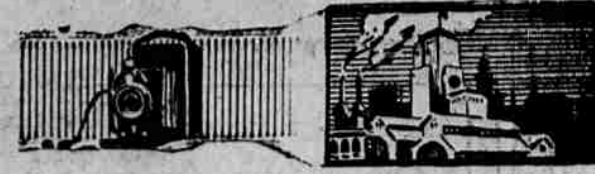


# CAMERAGRAMS

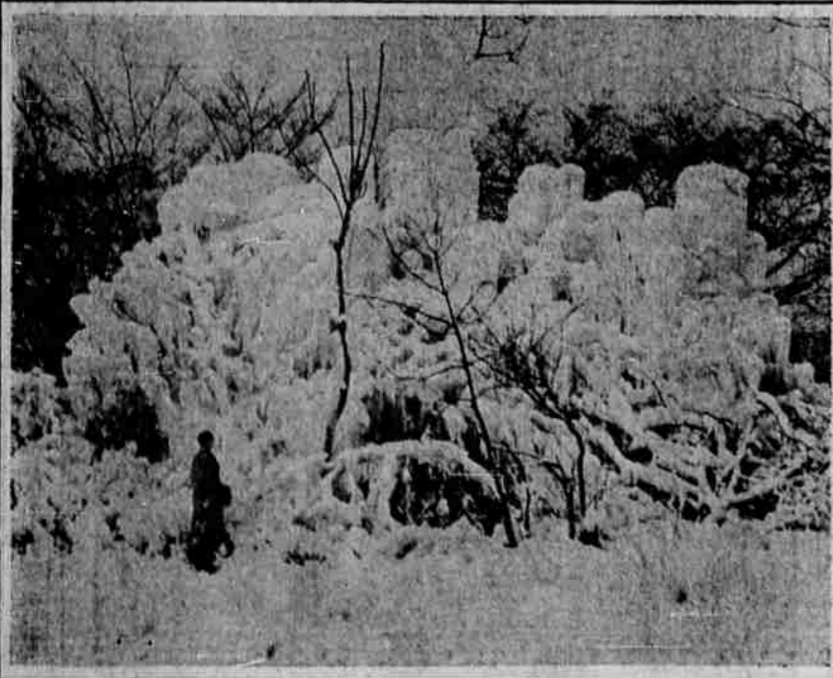
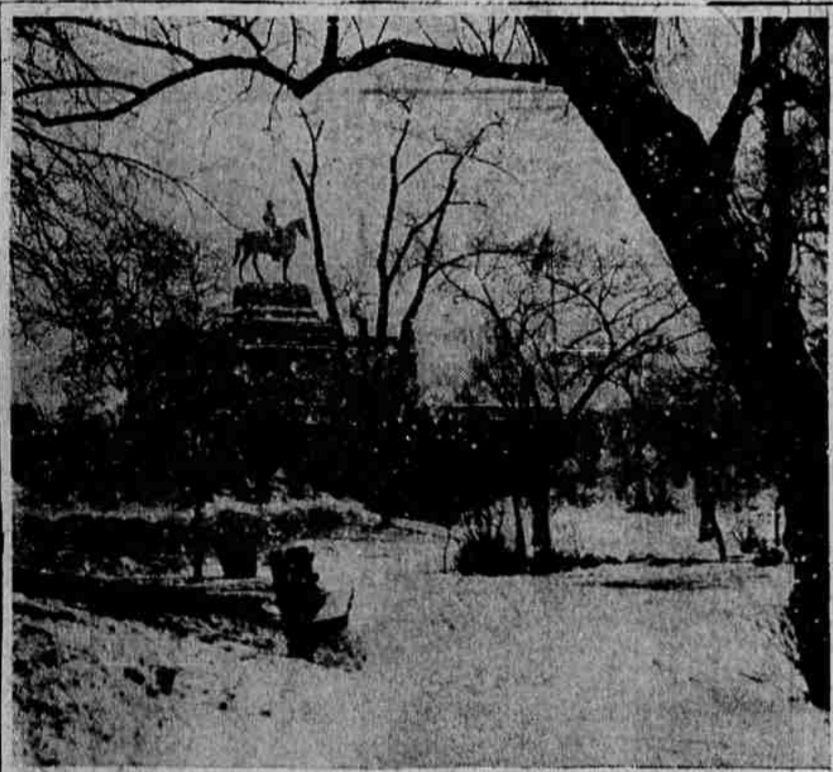

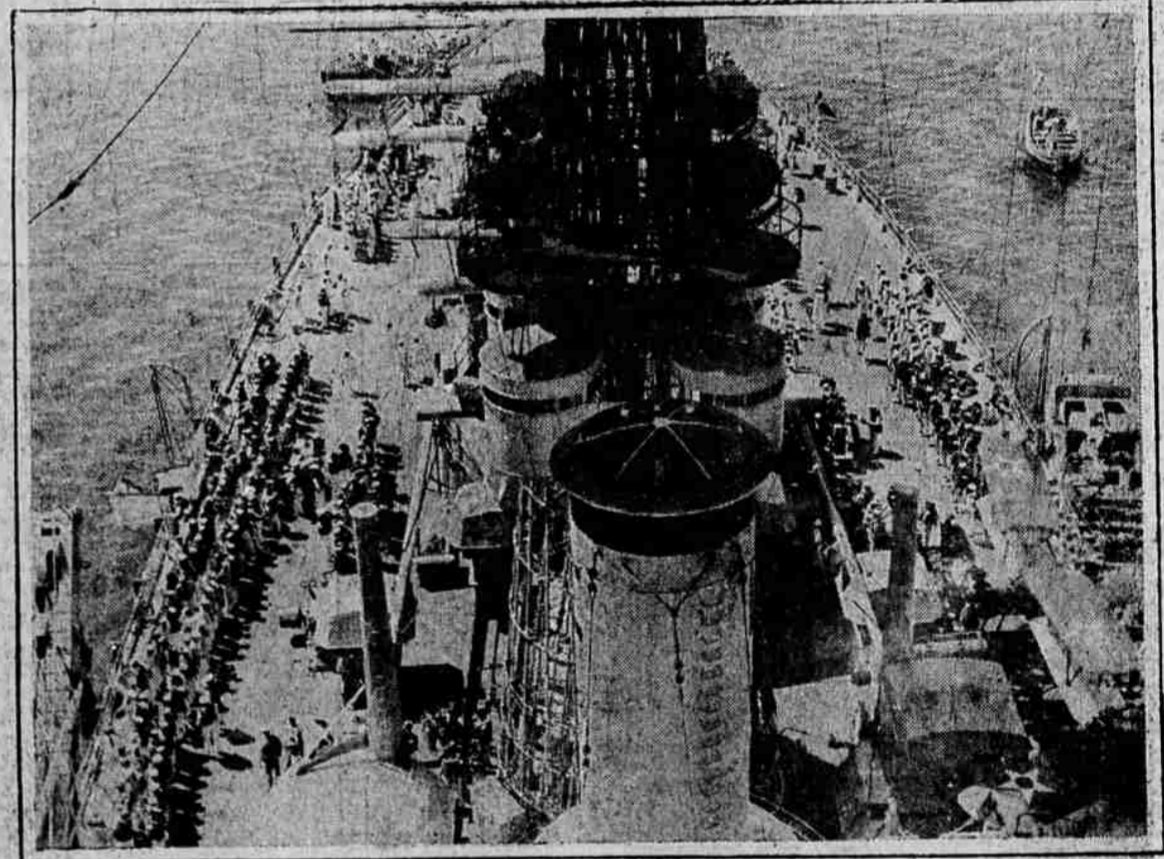

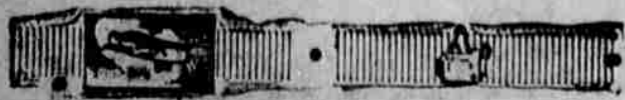
