TRADEWIND 'CLUE' MERELY ROCKETS

HORTA, Island of Fayal, Azores, Jan. 14. (AP)—A British cruiser engaged in gunnery practice off Sao Miguel Island, Azores, Sunday night unwittingly gave rise to a false hope of a clue to the disappearance of the airplane Tradedwind on its flight from Hamilton, Bermuda, Saturday. The cruiser sent up several rockets. One of these which disappeared into the ocean about 20 miles off Mosteiros Point, Sao Miguel, was mistaken by some for the Tradedwind falling into the sea and a radio station there is said to have broadcast an appeal to ships to keep a lookout in the vicinity.

SOLDIER MURDERS WIFE OF CAPTAIN

LAHORE, India, Jan. 14. (AP)—A former Sikh soldier, who yesterday killed Mrs. A. G. Curtis, wife of a British captain, and wounded her two small children, was held today and will be charged with murder. "I am a congressite (member of the nationalist organization) and I am going to kill the general," Jhan Singh shouted as he rushed on to the veranda of the bungalow, where Mrs. Curtis was seated. After slashing her fatally with a sword he attacked her two daughters, 7 and 6 years old.
