DANES MAY AWARD PRIZES TO ARTISTS

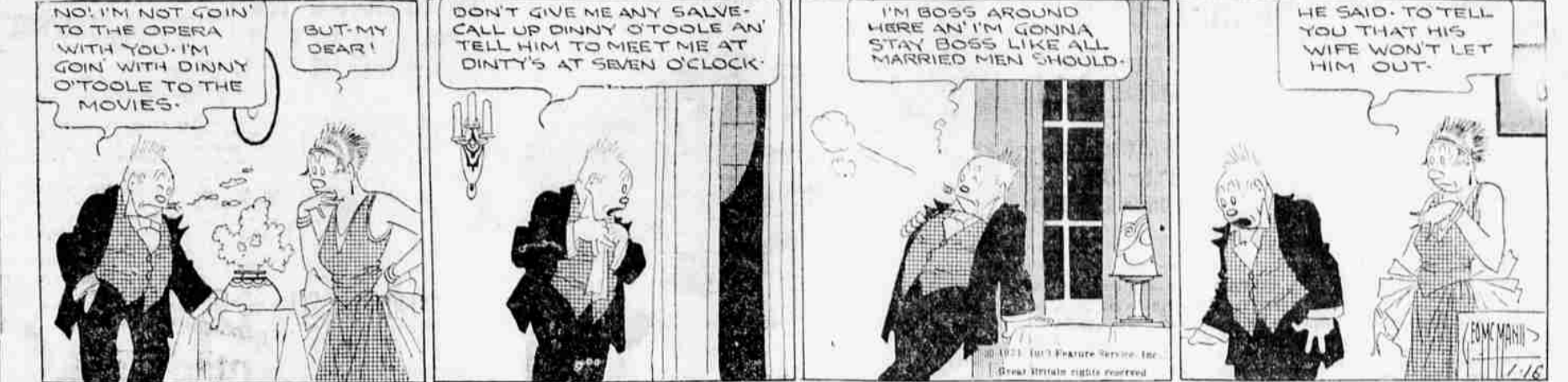
COPENHAGEN.—(AP)—An international prize for art, on lines similar to the Nobel prizes, is being considered by the administrators of the Carlsberg fund.
