PLENTY MILK FOR GROWING CHILDREN IS PLEA OF NURSE

A plea to parents to continue giving their children plenty of milk to drink was issued today by Mrs. Josephine Jones, Medford school nurse, in response to the tendency of numerous families to cut down on the milk supply because of business depression.

"There is a tendency just now to cut down on the amount of milk purchased as a means of reducing the cost of living," Mrs. Jones stated. "From a health view point this is the wrong thing to do, milk is the most important food, especially needed for the proper growth and development of children and for the maintenance of good health in both adults and children."

"If the amount of milk in the diet is reduced one may expect in return more illness, more doctor and dentist bills, loss of time from work and school. Even if not actually ill the energy of the individual is lessened so that one tires more easily, is less able to work and does a poorer quality of work. The school child makes poor grades, is absent from school a great deal with colds and other illnesses."

Lady Lawmakers of Land Generally of Middle Age; Oregon Boosts 'Youngster'

By DALE HARRISON (Copyright, 1931, by the Associated Press). NEW YORK, Jan. 22.—(AP)—The ladies, too, lay down the law. One hundred and forty-seven of them today are lawmakers. Only five states are without their influence. In each of the 42 legislatures in which they sit they constitute very small minorities.

Most of the women serving in state capitals this month reached there after well fought victories over male competition. Some won election despite membership in minority parties. A very few were elected in gallant gestures by their communities as widows of legislators who died in office.

Some are young. Indiana's only lawmaker, Miss Tella C. Haines, is barely a year out of the state university. Oregon has a representative, Dorothy McCullough Lee, who is not yet thirty. For the most part, however, these feminine state senators and representatives are middle aged.
