STORM IMPROVING WATER PROSPECT FOR VALLEY SOIL

Storm conditions prevailed today in all areas in the mountains where storage reservoirs for valley irrigation are, and will improve conditions. Snow was falling this morning, according to phone reports to the watermaster's office in the Fish Lake, Four-Mile Lake, Anna Springs, and Siskiyou districts.

A warm Chinook wind swept through the hills yesterday, melting the snow and this will increase the supply in the reservoirs, and the flow in the rivers and streams. A violent snowstorm raged this morning on Mt. Wagner, and in the Hiatt Prairie section.

As soon as the present storm subsides, new measurements of snow fall will be taken. Rain and snow in February and March will have an important bearing on water conditions during the coming season. According to the almanacs and expert weather opinion, they will be rainy and stormy months.
