

FRESNO POLICE SLAY FUGITIVE IN GUN BATTLE

and the probably fatal wound of Acting Police Lieutenant John O. Drame.

Soldo, object of a widespread hunt, was located by Drame and two other officers at the scene of the slaying of Campbell. They opened fire, wounding Soldo. Drame started after the fugitive, who turned and shot the acting lieutenant through the head. Soldo succeeded in reaching a shed on the premises, and all available officers were summoned.

In a few minutes the shed was surrounded by more than 20 policemen, firemen and American Legionnaires. They opened fire on each other intermittently for about two hours before the fugitive made a break for the open. Bullets cut him down quickly.

M'MATH BECOMES R. O. T. C. SERGEANT

OREGON STATE COLLEGE, Corvallis.—(Special.) Barton M. Math of Medford, a junior in commerce at Oregon State college this year, was recently promoted to the rank of first sergeant in the company unit of the local R. O. T. C.

VANCOUVER REDS JAILED FOR RIOT

VANCOUVER, B. C., Jan. 22.—(AP)—Eleven men were being held here today as a result of the celebration yesterday of the tenth anniversary and a near riot last night. Several policemen and others were injured in the two clashes, one policeman barely escaping having his eyes gouged out.

Constable William Clark was struck down by a brick hurled from the afternoon crowd and

was pounced upon by several demonstrators. One man was severely beaten by police after he had attempted to gouge out Clark's eyes.

CHINESE BANDITS KILL AND KIDNAP

KWEITUNG, China, Jan. 22.—(AP)—Bandits killed and wounded 400 persons and kidnaped 1800 others in capturing and looting a town 20 miles south of here today.

The military garrison of 10,000 soldiers about the town did not oppose the outlaws.

This and other parts of Honan province continued in the grip of the coldest spell experienced in 20 years. The populace has suffered

terribly and there have been many deaths.

OLEO COLORING LAW ATTACKED IN COURT

PORTLAND, Jan. 22.—(AP)—Colo-oring oleomargarine to the likeness of butter is defended in an attack filed on the Oregon law in Federal district court here by Duquesne Famous Foods, Inc. The suit seeks to restrain the state dairy and food commissioner from enforcing the law prohibiting manufacture and sale of oleomargarine artificially colored to imitate butter.
