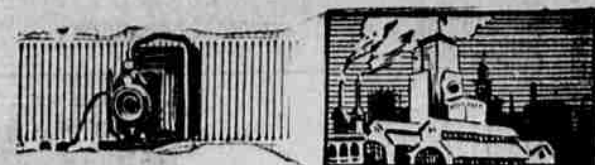
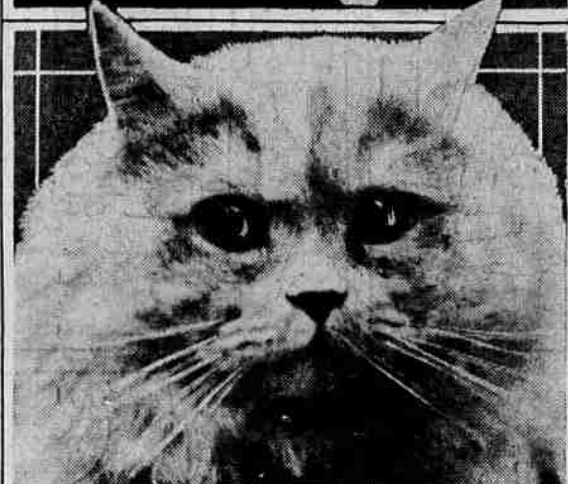
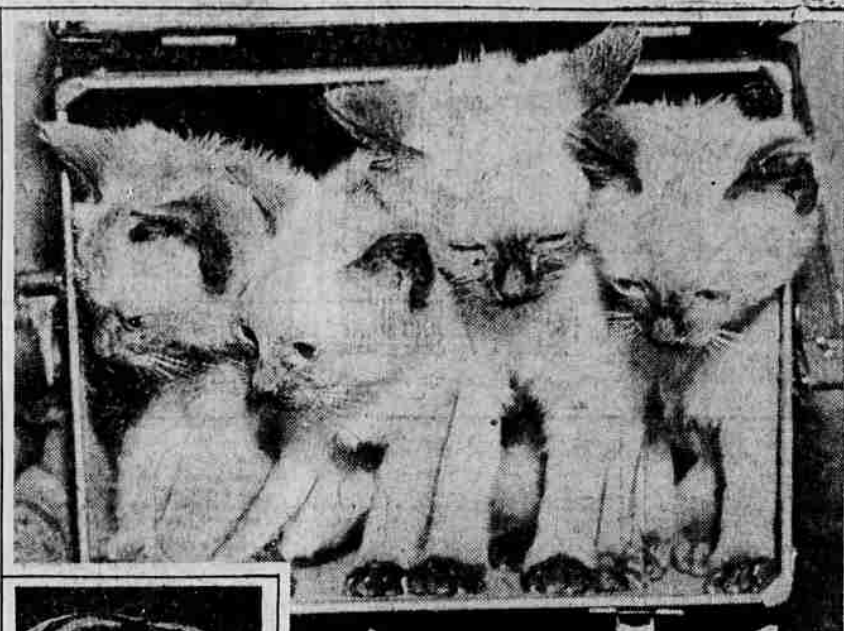


CAMERAGRAMS
