The Rogue River Traffic association at its short meeting this noon took under advisement the proposal that valley shippers attend a meeting to be held in Portland, about February 15, for a round table discussion with the shippers of the northwest of the 1931 Bartlett pear situation, to seek means for stabilization of prices and other major features of the pear industry. Letters were read showing that sentiment in the northwest districts favored such a meeting.

Among the leading questions proposed will be the 1931 cannery prices.

The association decided to take another week to consider the proposition and confer with outside sources and local interests.

There was an informal discussion of the proposition at today's session.

The New York pear committee has requested telegraphic information on the pears in storage in this district.

## Oregon-California Line Of Early Days Marked By Empty Liquor Bottle

(By Eva Nealon.)  
Twentieth century surveyors got a bit facetious with Uncle Sam's books when they resurveyed the Oregon-California boundary line. They checked up on Daniel G. Major, "astronomer and surveyor" too, and found out that he was drinking when he marked the line. October 1, 1867, according to the records on file at the county surveyor's office in this city.  
In his original survey, dated October 1, 1867, Mr. Major writes: "End of 147 mile on the line between Oregon and California, blazed and marked white fir tree three feet in diameter, deposited champagne bottle in hole two feet deep."  
February 15, 1915, Fred W. Rudolf and Aubrey H. Bond, reporting a resurvey of the line, write: "Interested in the 147 mile corner witnessed as described by Deputy Major, the growth on these trees shows that the corner was established in 1868. Champagne bottle reported deposited by Deputy Major was found at point of foot, proved to be a Hostetter's Bitters bottle instead of champagne."  
A third unidentified surveyor, who has gone through the records, has written in pencil at the side of the page: "Ha, ha! Major was nearly broke." And that was before prohibition.
