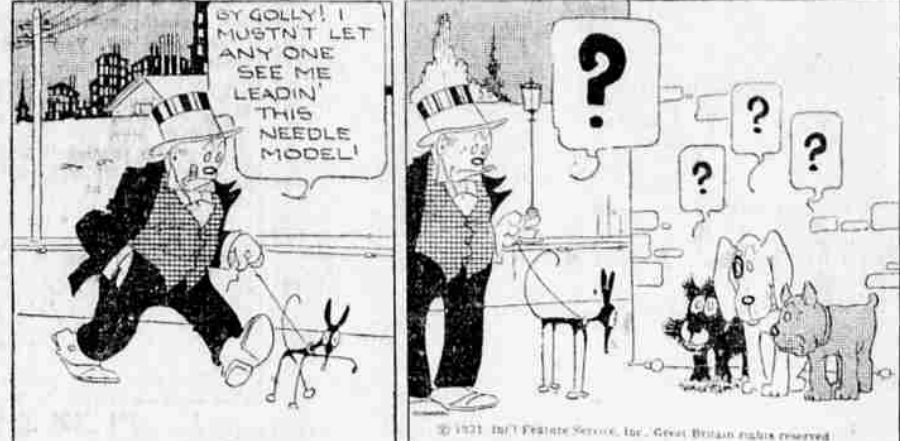

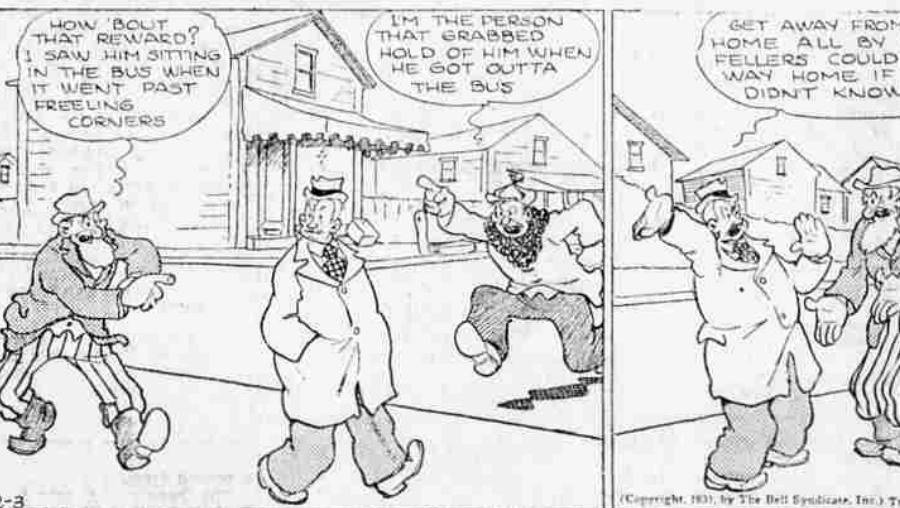
Wall Street Report
