BULLS BOOST SHARE PRICES IN ACTIVE DAY

NEW YORK, Feb. 9.—(AP)—Bulls opened their heavy artillery today, threw bears into full flight, and gave the stock market its best prices and most active trading of the new year.

As some 4,200,000 shares were traded, prominent stocks surged up 2 to 6 points, and a few erratic issues made wider gains.

PRODUCE MARKET OPENS UNCHANGED

PORTLAND, Ore., Feb. 9.—(AP)—Wholesale butter and egg quotations opened unchanged today. Butter receipts were slightly increased. Demand was flat, with attention centered on top grades. General tone was firm.

Butter storage holdings reported the last two Saturdays were 95,252 and 91,283 pounds respectively, a 4.2 percent decrease. Receipts last week were 72,878 pounds, an 18.1 percent increase.

Egg market continued weak with receipts showing an excess of demand and sales to retailers at irregular prices.

Wholesale fresh fruits and vegetables, country dressed meats and poultry opened at steady prices and active demand was reported in major lines following a good clean up Saturday.
