Ernie Nelson and son Ralph Nelson made a business trip to Klamath Falls this week.

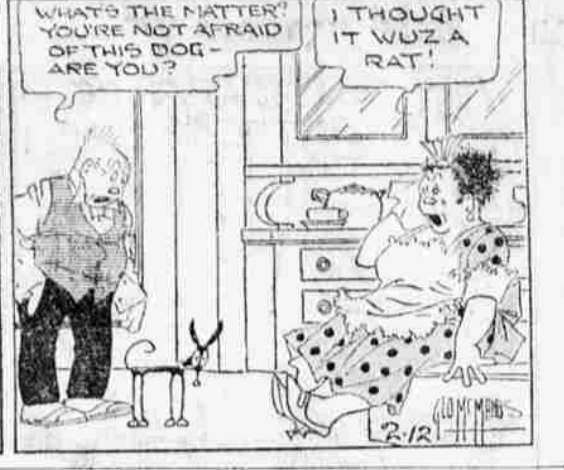
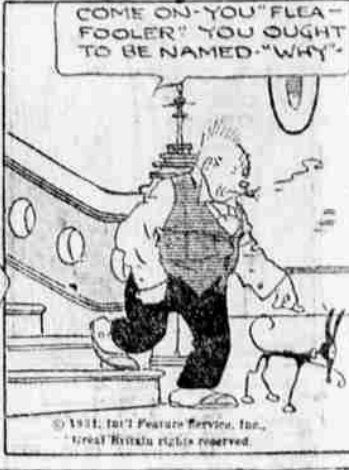
Byron Stoddard and Carl Dawson will attend the educational exposition in Corvallis Friday and Saturday.
