Wall Street Report

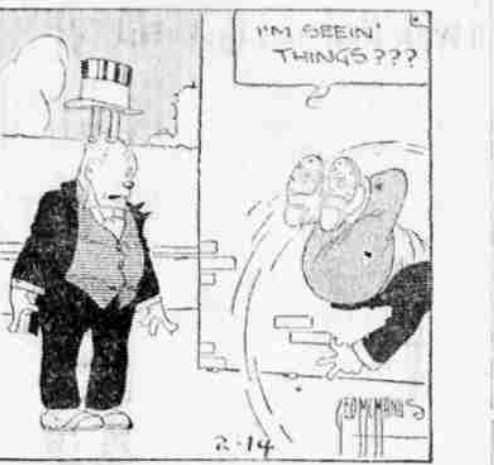
NEW YORK, Feb. 14.—(P)—A spark of two-end bullish enthusiasm in a dull week-end stock market today was sufficient to drag the list out of a moderate depression in the late dealings. Closing prices disclosed about an even mixture of gains and losses, with narrow changes in leading issues. The market showed at fairly steady tone at the finish. Temporary losses of 1 to 2 points in leading issues had been fairly general earlier. Transactions for the two-hour session were only about 1,100,000 shares.
