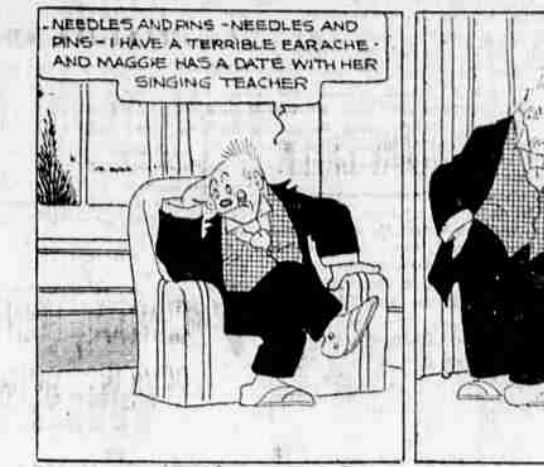
WALL STREET TAKING HOLIDAY FROM WORK
