

MEDFORD BOYS WAXING FAT AT CLATSOP CAMP

Guardsmen All Able to Hear
Mess Call—Clam Hunt

CAMP CLATSOP, Ore., June 19
(Special) — With less than a week remaining of the two weeks' training period here your correspondent feels that a few lines of local news pertaining to the two units from Medford will not be amiss. It was hoped that items of interest would be forwarded in from day to day, but the intensive training program mapped out this year has kept every one here almost too busy for letter writing.

Excellent weather has prevailed here with the exception of the first several days. Today we took a 10-mile hike in conjunction with working out a war problem against an imaginary enemy and as a result early evening finds most of our boys more or less tired out, but none the worse for wear or tear. Physically, our boys from Medford are standing up fine and very few have answered "sick call." And those few who have had minor ailments caused principally from "over eating" or colds, etc.

Lieut. Bruce Moffatt of Co. A held the limelight several days ago when he gave a lecture to the entire regiment on "Callisthenics."

Each squad of eight men is in charge of a corporal, who not only exercises control in drill work but has control over them in camp, as eight men are domiciled in each tent with their corporal in charge. This year every member of both companies has a trunk locker, which enables him to take much better care of his personal equipment. Company A also has a new mess hall this year and instead of eating out of the old time-worn mess kits the company purchased a brand new complete set of porcelain dishes, so the boys are eating in more or less style now—and like it much better than the old way. And besides this improvement a new two-oven kitchen range was purchased by Company A and installed in their new mess hall, so we are now well equipped and have about everything necessary for the proper functioning of our company here.

One Clam Captured.

At least most of the boys wouldn't dare eat as much at home as they do here—and are the eggs good?—well ask Dr. B. R. Elliott, whom we had as our guest last night. "Doc" is vacationing at Seaside and took supper with us last night, together with his family. Most of the boys have gained in weight and all are looking fine, evidence that the outdoor life near the ocean is doing them a lot of good.

We break camp next Tuesday morning, June 23, arriving in Portland that noon, and after spending the afternoon and evening there "on leave," our special train pulls out at 11 p.m., and will arrive in Medford shortly before noon Wednesday, June 24.
