

# LINDY NOT PIONEERING WEST TRAIL

Pacific Predecessors Take Glory From Contemplated Flight — Army Airmen Took North Path in 1924 — Hop to Hawaii Often

WASHINGTON, (AP) — In trans-Atlantic flight, the name of Charles A. Lindbergh stands supreme among all pilots, but in the Pacific predecessors have left records which it seems impossible to equal.

Whether he takes a North Pacific, or trans-Arctic route, the glory of the "pioneer" has already gone very largely to others, some already half forgotten in the swift scroll of aeronautical history. The first great pilot in Pacific aviation history will memorialize the westbound crossing by the Army aviators in 1924, accomplished successfully by three Douglas airplanes equipped with 450-horsepower Liberty motors. The flight was commanded by Lieutenant (later Captain) Lowell H. Smith, after Flight Leader Major Frederick L. Martin and a fourth plane had crashed against a mountain near Chignik, Alaska.

The Army fliers flew along the Alaskan coast and the Aleutian Islands to Attu, the intended point of departure for a non-stop flight to Japan. In fact, weather compelled an intermediate landing at the Komandorski Islands. The final jump of 555 miles, to Paramushiro, Japan, was made through cold and fog.

The Army fliers arrived at Tokyo May 22, having completed a 5,577 mile, 75-hour and 55-minute flying time since their departure from Lake Washington, Seattle, on April 6. Enthusiastically welcomed in Japan, they later continued a triumphant round-the-world tour.

The next thrilling chapter in trans-Pacific history was the attempted eastbound crossing by the British pilot, G. G. Seton, and his companions. In a Vickers amphibian plane they flew with stops en route 1,610 miles from Attu, Japan, to Nikolai in the Komandorski Islands, where their plane was wrecked and the attempt necessarily abandoned.

Commander John Rodgers and crew on a naval seaplane gained near immortality when they almost accomplished a flight from the California coast to Hawaii August 31-September 1, 1925. They were forced to alight at sea about 450 miles from Honolulu, and nine days elapsed before they were rescued.

The year 1927 witnessed several successes in the California to Hawaiian Islands flight. The Army fliers, Lester J. Maitland and Albert F. Hegenberger made the trip first, in a tri-motor Fokker plane, June 28-29, 1927. They traveled 2,490 miles in 25 hours and 50 minutes, their trip successful in every detail.

Two weeks later Ernest L. Smith and Emory B. Bronte flew from Oakland, Calif., to Molokai Island, where their plane was wrecked in landing after 25 hours and 36 minutes in the air.

The Dole Race, from Oakland, Calif., to Honolulu, starting August 16, 1927, was won by Arthur C. Goebel and Lieut. William V. Davis in 25 hours 17 minutes 23 seconds. Martin Jensen and Paul Scheuter took second place in 25 hours and 16 minutes. Two other planes in the race were lost in the search for them.

The immortals in South Pacific aviation were Captain Charles Kingsford-Smith and Captain Charles P. Elin, pilots, Australian; Harry W. Lyon, navigator, and James Warner, radio operator, Americans, who flew from Oakland, Calif., to Australia by way of the Hawaiian and Fiji Islands. The trip of 7,915 miles to Brisbane was made in 86 hours

and 23 minutes flying time. The flight started May 31, 1928. Lyon's single hop was 3,138 miles from Barking Sands beach to Suva.

**Graf's Pacific Flight**  
Two great chapters in Pacific air history were written in 1929. The Graf Zeppelin, in the course of a round-the-world flight, left Tokyo August 23, and flew 5,599 miles to Los Angeles airport in 78 hours and 53 minutes, the first non-stop trip by air across the great ocean.

The second great event of the year was the successful flight from Moscow to New York by a twin-engine all-metal monoplane, which made the trip of 13,200 miles in 142 flying hours, during several hours elapsed time. The plane carried four men, the first pilot being Semyon Shostakov, and second pilot Philip Biotov.

The route was from Kamchatka to Attu in the Aleutians, thence via Dutch Harbor,eward, and Sitka to northwestern United States. Lindbergh was among the welcoming throng at Curtiss Field, New York.
