BUTTER AND EGGS OPEN QUIET WITH NO PRICE CHANGE

PORTLAND, June 22.—(P)—General trade conditions in the butter market are quiet. Make and of ferlags show a liberal increase for recent days and an especially good supply of undergrades of noted.

Basis of prices in the egg market shows little, if any, material change for recent days. Receipts are heavy about holding their own while storage demand is losing. Stock available for fresh consumption is therefore little changed.

PORTLAND, June 22.—(P)—Berries sold better on the East Side farmers' market today. Prices were steady to firmer in spots but the call was improved except for loganberries. Sales were shown \$1.00-1.25.

Strawberries sold \$1.50-2.00, the former for Etterbergs and the latter for Best Oregon. General business was \$1.75-1.50.

Blackberries sold \$1.55-1.75 crate with raspberries \$1.25-1.50 but mostly \$1.25-1.40.

Demand for currants was excellent at \$1.05-1.75 crate. Green beans moved 7-8c lb. Peas found a good call at 5-6c; the latter for Telephones.

Radishes moved fairly well; most 20c doz. bunches. Cabbage market was fairly steady 75-80c crate.

New potatoes showed an excellent movement at 2 1/2c lb. for best. Dallas cucumbers sold \$1 box. Dallas squash sold \$1.25 for top stall.

Cauliflower was mostly \$1 crate. Asparagus held firm at \$1 doz. bunches.

Spinach was slow at 40-45c orange box. Lettuce sold rapidly at 70-80c generally. Turnips moved at a spread of 25-50c doz. bunches.

PORTLAND, June 22.—(P) While there was a somewhat greater run of livestock at North Portland over Sunday as compared with any recent Monday, almost runaway prices were shown in spots, reflecting the general advance in commodities throughout the world as a result of the debt statement of President Hoover.

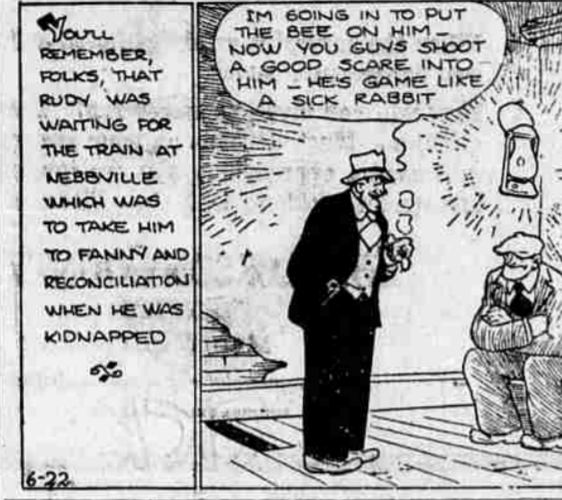

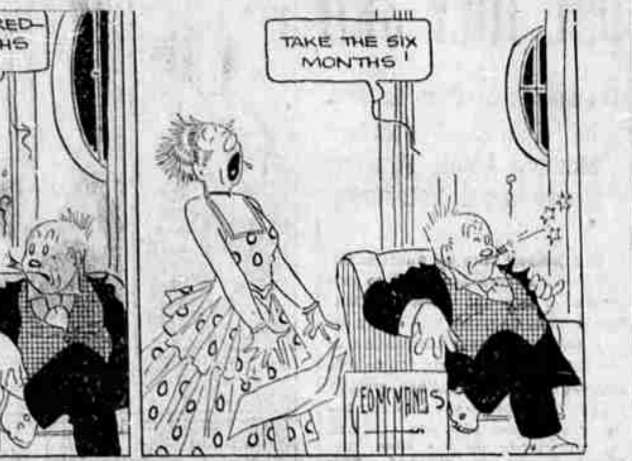
