What Moratorium Would Cost Creditor Nations in Income During 1931 and 1932

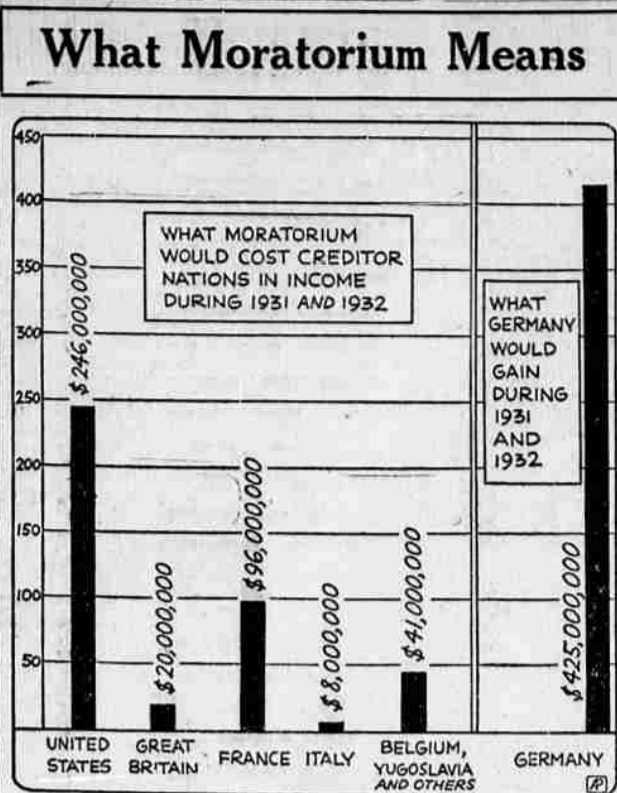

Debt Holiday in Brief

WASHINGTON, (AP)—The moratorium on war debts and reparations would cost the United States about \$246,000,000 in income for the year beginning July 1. Great Britain and France would lose approximately \$20,000,000 and \$96,000,000 respectively. These amounts the extent of their reparation money from Germany over their own to other countries.

GRAND JURORS PAID ONLY FOR COURT DUTIES

Codding Gets Opinion From Attorney General Van Winkle On Pay for Probe Dahack, Kingsley Cases

SALEM, Ore., July 1.—(AP)—Compensations for grand jurors are based on "attendance upon a court of record," and they are not entitled to pay during interims when not in session, Attorney-General I. H. Van Winkle stated in an opinion today. He made his findings at the request of G. A. Codding, district attorney of Jackson county.

Watermasters, using their own cars in performance of their duties in the state, do not come under the new statutes providing a 6 cent a mile rate for auto expense, the attorney-general held in another opinion.

Only deputy game wardens, authorized by the governor and superintendent of the state police are to be appointed and be under the direction of the state game commission, the attorney-general informed the commission. Van Winkle further held that otherwise the duties of law enforcement devolving upon game wardens prior to the enactment of the state police law are to be performed by the police department.

STATE TRAINING SCHOOL TARGET IN NEW ATTACK

Hearing On Cruelty Charges Promised by Board of Control — Women's League Demands Action

SALEM, July 1.—(AP)—A new hearing on charges in connection with the operation and management of the state training school for boys will be held by the board of control within the next six weeks. The special session at which time complaints against W. H. Baillie, superintendent of the school, will be aired, was set by the board after Mrs. A. W. Nicholson, Portland, representing the Oregon Women's Civic league, had appeared before the board and insisted upon an immediate hearing.

Mrs. Nicholson, accompanied by Abraham Levey, father of Vernon Levey over whom a hearing was held nearly a year ago, charged that the state training school for boys had not been conducted in the best interests of the public and that the inmates are yet being subjected to cruelties.

LYTLE APPOINTED AS GEHLHAR AIDE

SALEM, July 1.—(AP)—Max Gehlhar, director of agriculture, today appointed Dr. W. H. Lytle as chief of the animal industry division of the new department of agriculture, which becomes effective in Oregon tomorrow. Dr. Lytle has been state veterinarian for 18 years. His salary will be \$2800 a year. As veterinarian he received \$4200 annually.

Under Lytle's department will come animal disease control, quarantines, brand recording, station licensing, live-stock theft prevention, predatory animal control, inspection and licensing of meat dealers and slaughterhouses, supervision of county meat and herd inspectors, supervision of county veterinarians and of county stock inspectors.

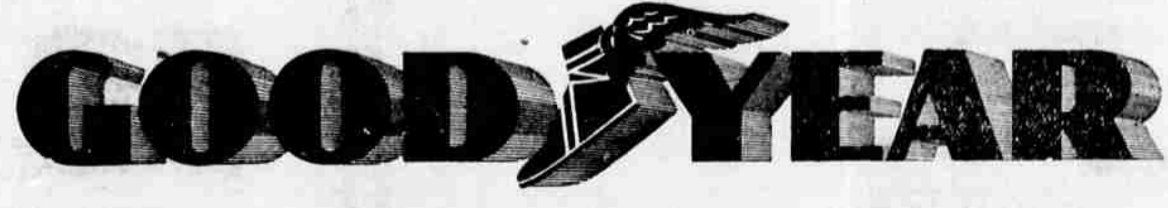
