Chicago Needs Detective Solve Failure of Wilson Regain Slugging Stride

CHICAGO—(AP)—Solution of the Hack Wilson mystery is one for Philo Vance, Sherlock Holmes or Scotland Yard.

Cub fans and the closest baseball writers have given up their investigations as unfinished business.

Ever since the Cubs unloaded at Catalina island, their spring proving ground out in the Pacific, the one big item of conversation has been the hitting slump of the pudgy outfielder, who hammered out 56 home runs last year in delectable Babe Ruth and broke the all-time major league record for runs batted in.

But the mystery remains unsolved.

Those closest to Wilson insist that Hack's hitting slump is just one of those things, and that there isn't a semblance of a disagreement between him and Manager Rogers Hornsby.

Hornsby Quiet

They point out truthfully that Wilson's swing is the same as a year ago, that he apparently tries as hard as ever and that he and Hornsby in public, off and on the diamond, are the best of friends.

Hornsby, himself, refuses to talk about the matter, except that he believes Hack may be trying too hard.

"Hack's all right and he'll be back before long," Hornsby said. "My only guess is that he is trying too hard and is pressing. There isn't a harder worker in the game than Wilson and when he doesn't hit I'm satisfied that he's trying anyway."

Not Personal

Those who know Hornsby know he has no personal likes or dislikes like them and they can hit them stay in. If he likes them and they can't hit, out they go. At the start of the first Cub home stay, he benched Wilson when Hack's average was .250, for Johnny Moore. When Moore's average fell to that mark Hornsby replaced him with Wilson, who started to hit again.

"I can't understand why people keep gossiping about this matter," Hornsby said. "You know that all I want the Cubs to do is to win every game possible. I don't care what my players do off the diamond as long as I'm satisfied that they are doing their best."

"I don't have regulations except when I'm convinced that a player's habits are interfering with his baseball. Then I'm bound to take steps. Wilson has just been reprimanded because he hasn't needed reprimand."

Needs Hot Weather

There isn't an unhappy player in the majors this year than Hack Wilson. He is a picture of sadness.

"Please don't bring that up," he broke out when he was asked what was wrong. "I want to forget my slump and seek that ball a mile. Maybe I've been pressing too hard but I feel better now and feel that I'm over the rough spots."

Hornsby? No, sir, he's treated me kindly and kept me in there when I should have been warming the bench. He's okay."

The best guess is that all Wilson needs to be the terror he was last year is two straight weeks of

hot weather. A glance over the box scores proves that the hotter the weather, the hotter the line drives off the Wilsonian bludgeon. He's a hot weather hitter and the weather so far this season has been cold.

SHAKESPEAREAN STUDENT TALKS TO GUILD GROUP

Before a group of interested listeners, invited to St. Mark's guild hall Wednesday evening through the courtesy of Ed Andrews, Judge G. C. H. Corlies of Portland, a practicing attorney for the past 50 years, discoursed upon "Macbeth," presenting his own interpretation as well as those of eminent critics and scholars of the past and present age.

At 15 years of age he dreamed of being a great actor, the speaker confided. Shakespeare has been his lifelong interest and pleasure, he said, and Wednesday evening he disclosed another, but more unusual, ambition—to plead the case of Lady Macbeth before every jury in the land.

Going into some detail concerning a number of popular fallacies in the plot and action of the great tragedy, and disputed motivations of the more prominent characters, Judge Corlies gave no uncertain impression that the mental processes of a practicing attorney found sufficient metal in the dramas of one William Shakespeare, and that a discerning mind and sympathetic heart were almost, if not wholly, as necessary as scholasticism, for insight and consequent understanding.
