MOST PRODUCE IN SLOW MOVEMENT; PEAS SNAPPED UP

PORTLAND, July 3. — (AP) — There was one isolated strong spot in the entire large supply of produce offered on the east side market today. This spot was peas. Only one load arrived and it lasted no more than 10 minutes. The entire offering brought 5 cents a pound. Practically everything else moved slowly. Buyers were extremely cautious and farmers were anxious to sell — an ideal combination to force lower prices over the holiday week-end. Raspberries hit an early high of \$1.10, but could not hold that level. Most sales were 90c-\$1.10. Corn was more abundantly offered. Yellow varieties were offered freely at 40-50 cents a dozen, and did not sell readily at that price. A truck load of early white peaches moved at 75 cents. A few plums sold at 90 cents, but there wasn't much business in these. Green beans sold at 4 cents and wax brought a penny more. Potatoes were steady at \$1.25 for an orange box full.

EGGS SLATED FOR RAISE NEXT WEEK

PORTLAND, Ore., July 3. — (AP) — The trading week ending today finds the egg market in a good healthy condition and two cents higher than a week ago for top grades. The general set of circumstances surrounding the market indicates that another boost might come early in next week. In the event of decidedly higher temperatures, the advance in top grade eggs has more than a fifty-chance of coming to pass. Receipts have been light compared with demand, dealers assert they are getting barely enough top quality stuff to go around.

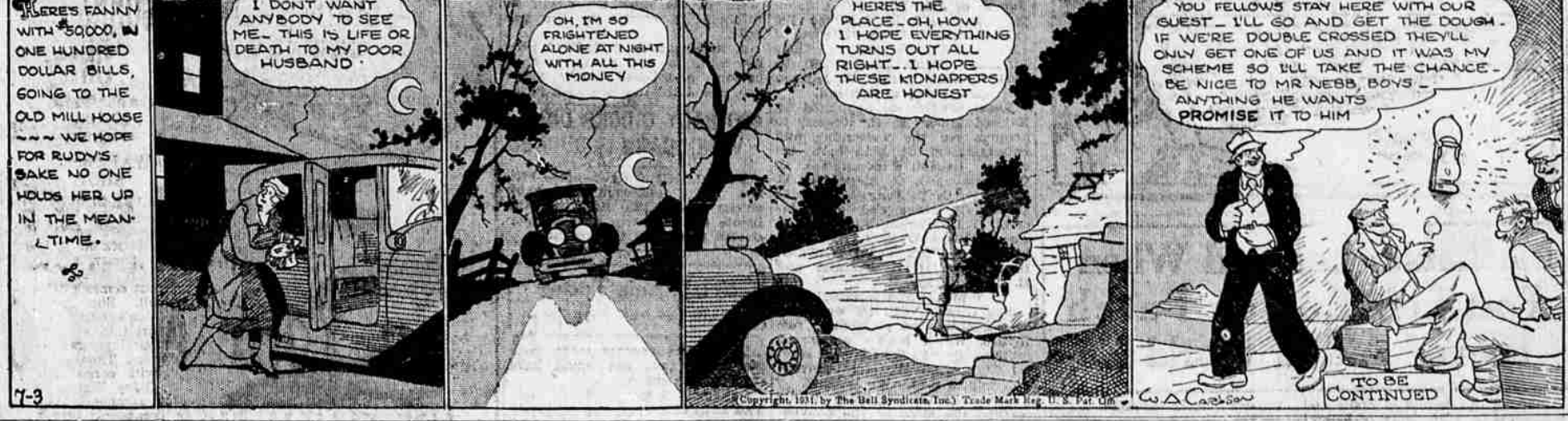
