This is not a sign of moral depravity; it is only evidence of the fact that children share with adults the desire to avoid the unpleasant and to get pleasure even in the face of obstacles.

It is only when reasonable pleasures have been denied him that he tries to deceive the parents into giving him what he wants.

When the child needs to be relieved of the fear of excessive punishment and disapproval. He needs also to feel that his parents are ready to grant him every reasonable satisfaction, that he has only to present his wish in a straightforward way to be sure that it will be given sympathetic consideration.
