## SLASH ORDERED FOR LIVESTOCK FREIGHT RATES

C. C. Demands Revision in West—New Tariffs Based on Mileage, Fix Minimum Carload Weight

WASHINGTON, July 17.—(AP)—The interstate commerce commission today ordered revision of freight rates in the west on livestock, in most instances charges being reductions from the old rates.

The decision fixed new rates on mileage of hauls for cattle, calves, hogs, sheep and goats, set minimum carload weights, fixed terminal charges and dealt generally with the livestock situation.

## PROTEST ON RATE RAISE FORWARDED

Oregon Shippers Join in Opposing Proposed 15 Per Cent Increase in Freight—Hearing in Portland Requested by Groups

SALEM, July 17.—(AP)—Shippers of Oregon last night wired their protests of the proposed 15 per cent increase in freight rates to the interstate commerce commission, and set out in the Telegram the position Oregon would take in the forthcoming hearings. The wire was composed following an executive meeting of shippers with Charles M. Thomas, public utilities commissioner.
